

charged the Chief Magistrate of this City, with Partiality in favour of Mr. Rochford, at the Publick Scales.

And whereas the Mayor has heard from the best Authority, that the said James Lyne has declared he will (as heretofore) buy and store up Corn for foreign Exportation, without weighing it at the Publick Scales, and thereby prevent the Mayor from making just and fair Returns to the Custom-House, as by Law directed, from striking a proper Assize for Bread, or a reasonable Price for Meal, and also have an Opportunity of defrauding the Publick, by concealing the real Price of Corn, and the Corporation of the Toll; the Mayor gives him this Publick Notice, that if he should pursue such Measures, so injurious to the Inhabitants of this City, and so contrary to Law, he will punish him as the Law directs.

And whereas the Mayor has received Information on Oath, that notwithstanding the great Quantity of Oats bought by the exporting Merchants these few Days past, many Gentlemen and others, Inhabitants of this City, could not get a single Bag of Oats, but through the Medium of a Merchant, it being mostly engaged at the Venues leading to the City, and at the Market before the proper Hour, as prescribed by Law; the Mayor has given strict orders for the future (whilst there is any Oats in the Country) that the Inhabitants of the City must be supplied, before any shall be weighed off for the Exporter; a Partiality no doubt, the modest Mr. Lyne will complain of; but the Mayor recommends to him to read the Laws against Monopoly, Forestalling and Frauds, before he should put his Threats into Execution.
