Viscount and Viscountess Guillamore and suite, have arrived at Cahir Guillamore from Pembroke-road, Dublin.

The petition of Mr. Richard Uniacke Power against the Earl and Countess of Huntington, for an account of a moiety of the rents of the property of Kilgabriel, county Waterford, demised in 1809 by Richard Power, grandfather of the Countess, is confirmed with costs, by the Lord Chancellor, against the respondents.

Thomas Costelloe, Esq. coroner, held an inquest at Greenmount on the body of Thomas Feore, in the employ of Capt. Green, who was killed by the fall of a wall near which the unfortunate man was excavating. Verdict—'accidental death.'

Professor Melville, M.D. lectured on Monday evening to the Limerick Literary Scientific Society upon the form and distribution of Plants, &c. and this evening his subject will be the form and distribution of Animals,

At Parsonstown Petty Sessions two summonses by John Bindon Alton, Esq. Secretary to Conservators of the Fisheries of the Limerick district, against Charles Dunne were called, for taking fish in a mill pond during the close season, and for using a gaff for taking fish in fresh water without a fishing rod.—The magistrates were of opinion that there ought to be a conviction on the summons for using a device to catch fish, and the other charge to be dismissed. The court inflicted a mitigated penalty of £2.

The Queen's Bench has refused an order for criminal information at the instance of Capt. Wolfe, against Major Thomas, of Kill, King's County, who complained of the bad state of a house he rented from the former.

The present prosperity of the Irish farmers, after years of depression, is ascribed to the high prices realised for cattle, butter, and every other agricultural produce. The result of this is, that armers are not straightened for money, they have sufficient to meet all demands, and they are thus enabled to keep back their corn, in the anticipation of still better markets and higher prices than now. Through the country immense stocks of corn remain in the yards of the farmers treshed, and they show no disposition to bring this produce to market.

CLOSE SEASON FOR SALMON—The Fisheries Commissioners have decided that the close time for salmon or fish of the salmon kind, in any estuary, or on the sea coast, or in the tideway of any river, or the part thereof where the tide ebbs and flows, shall from henceforth be between the 31st day of July in seal.
