SIXMILEBRIDGE DISPENSARY.

There was a letter from Dr Fitzgerald asking that the hours for attendance at the Sixmilebridge Dispensary be shortened by one hour. He could always do the work in half an hour, and it very rarely took that time. He had been speaking to Sir Acheson McCullagh, and he was of opinion that two hours were not required in any outside dispensary, and he thought that the Local Government Board would have no objection to the change.

Mr O'Flynn gave the necessary notice of motion to have the change made, provided the doctor could do the work in time.

KILLANIV DISPENSARY.

The Local Government Board wrote asking to have sent on an application for the Board's Certificate under Section 4 of the Dispensary Houses Act with the documents asked for in a former letter in relation to the proposal to provide a Medical Officer's residence for the Killaniv Dispensary District.

The Clerk said that they had not got the plans yet from Mr O'Donnell.

After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Engineer.

Paying orders to the amount of £1,850 were issued.

The Board adjourned after a short sitting.

DEATH OF LIEUTENANT-COLONEL STEWART ORR.

The death is announced of Lieut-Colonel A. Stewart Orr, D.S.O., late of the 2nd Battalion Royal Irish Regiment. Deceased, who resided at Hillcroft, Epsom, was youngest son of the late Mr William Orr, of Hugomont, Ballymena, and brother of County Court Judge Orr. He served through the Egyptian campaign, and in India, and during the Boer War was mentioned in dispatches being responsible for the capturing of the Boer Commandant, Ben Viljoen. He was then promoted Colonel in command of the Horse Battalion, Royal Irish, a position he held until his retirement.

MARKING PIGS AT FAIRS.

At Ballymahon Petty Sessions, Mr Francis McGowan, a Midland pig dealer, was prosecuted for marking pigs so as to cause them unnecessary suffering. Captain Clark suggested the use of a ring around the neck of the pig, and small label attached.

Mr Farrell, solicitor, said that would be too inconvenient where so many pigs were shipped.

The Resident Magistrate refused to convict until the Department of Agriculture suggested a legal means of branding.
