Extract of a letter from an Officer, high in rank  
in Spain, received last post by his friend in this  
City:—"In this Province (Galicia) we are organiz-  
ing a Reserve, which I hope will be a state of for-  
wardness the beginning of Winter, and perhaps fit  
to join the armies of operation in Spring;—General  
Lacy is to have the command of this force."

The High Sheriff and Grand Jury of the County  
of Cork, presented an Address to his Grace the  
Duke of Richmond, late Lord Lieutenant, expres-  
sive of their regret, at his departure from the Go-  
vernment of this Country.

The Most Noble the Marquis of Downshire is at  
present on a visit, at the elegant residence of the  
Hon. W. Quin M. P. Adare, in this county.

A letter from Edinburgh, gives as a very prevalent  
rumour on Wednesday week in that City, that the  
President frigate, Commodore Rodgers, had been  
captured by the Norge line of battle ship, Captain  
Rainer.

Extract of a letter from Kingston, (Jamaica,) to a  
Merchant in Cork—"No further supply of Sugars  
can be sent to your Market till next year, as the  
crops have fallen short fully one-third of what they  
were last year."

Yesterday morning about nine o'clock, there was  
most dreadful thunder heard in the direction from  
Patrick's Well, towards Adare and Rathkeale, in  
this County; the peals were very violent and contin-  
ued for a considerable time, and were accompanied  
with some awful appearances—large fragments of  
atmospheric stones, and other circumstances, which  
indicated some very serious concussion to have  
taken place.

It appears by the Returns made of the Population  
of the City of Cork under the late Act, that 8,878  
Houses are inhabited, and contain 15,258 Families,  
which consist of 32,538 Males and 42,417 Females,  
being a difference of 9,829 on the part of the Females.  
The total Population is 75,005; but some Persons  
maintain that the total should exceed by several  
thousands the numbers set forth in those documents.

Cork Races, at the request of a number of Gentie-  
men whose Horses are engaged at the Meetings of  
Birr, Sligo, and Tramore, are postponed from the  
23d inst. to the 7th October.

The sloop Evander of Greenock, Robert Carr,  
Master, which sailed from Cork with the Newfound-  
land convoy, put back. She parted the fleet Tues-  
day last at noon, 60 miles to the westward of Cape  
Clear.

His Majesty's ship Leonidas, Capt. Seymour, five  
Transports with Artillery Drivers for Bimboa and the  
Trade ready for St. Andero, Lisbon &c. sailed with  
a fine breeze from Cove, on Wednesday last.
