The property of Lord Sandwich, England. Contains 856 a. 1 r. 6 p., including about 70 acres of rough pasture, and

the remainder arable land. In the S. of the td. is Knock-aunsteage Trigl. Station. In the N. part are St. James' Holy Well, a Church in ruins and burial ground, a remarkable bush called Parknoe Bush, and St. Bridgets Holy Well. In the E. of the td. is an ancient fort.

In the S.W. of this td. are a Rock called Dermot and Grania's Bed and a Glebe. In the S.E. is an ancient fort, and there is another in the W. part of the td.
