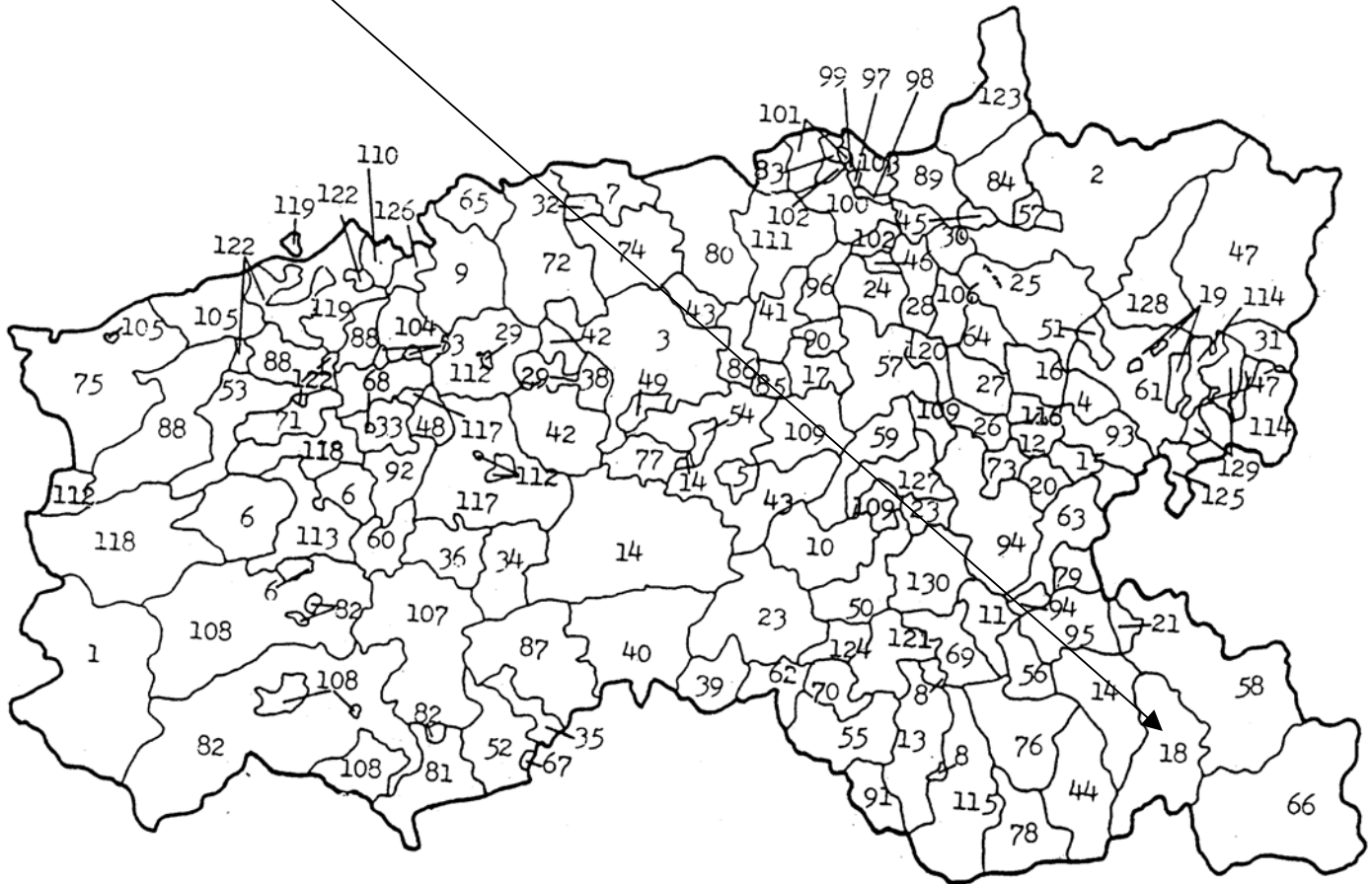

Bounded on the N. by Galbally Ph.; on the W. by Glenbrohane Ph.; on the E. by the Phs. of Galbally and Kilbeheny; and on the S. by the Phs. of Darragh and Marshalstown, (Darragh in Co. Limerick, and Marshalstown in Co. Cork).

Contains 7719 a. statute measure, and is almost entirely owned by the Earl of Kingston, Mitchelstown, Co. Cork. In general it may be said to be arable land interspersed with portions of rough pasture of a boggy nature. It abounds with roads, and has a number of ancient forts interspersed. It is generally well cultivated.

The property of the Earl of Kingston. Contains 749 a. 3 r. 11 p. statute measure. Adjacent to the S. and W boundaries there are some small portions of rough pasture; the remainder of the td. is arable. In the S. of the td. there is a large village, with a Church and a Chapel, and a Dispensary called Ballylanders. There are 3 ancient forts in the td., one called Banaraha Fort to the N. of the village. There is also a graveyard with the ruins of an old church in the centre of it. There is a number of roads through the townland.

Is the property of the Earl of Kingston. Contains 597 acres, statute measure. The general quality of the land is arable, with a few small portions of rough pasture interspersed. There is one road in E. of the td., bearing N. & S. In the E., also, is an ancient fort called Ballyduff Fort. In the centre of the td. there is a Trigl. Station called Ballyduff.

Is the property of the Earl of Kingston. Contains 519 a. 2 r. 11 p. st. measure. The greater part of the td. is arable, with a few small portions of bog attached to the E. and W. boundaries. A few houses are interspersed. In the centre of the td. is a Trigl. Station called Ballybrien.

The property of the Earl of Kingston. Contains 679 acres st. measure. The general quality is arable land interspersed with small portions of rough pasture. There are 5 ancient forts in the td, one in the S.E., the others in the N. About the centre there is a Cross Roads thus:-

The most southerly fort is called Tampleen, with a Trigl. Station called Glanaturk erected on it. There is one road about the centre of the td. bearing S.E. and N.W.

Stations, Knockbrack central, Knockafinogue in the E.

The road from Ballylanders to Mitchelstown passes directly N. & S. through the td. Nearly central and W. of the road there is an ancient fort called Hence Fort.

Is the property of the Earl of Kingston, containing 608 a. 3 r. 5 p. statute measure. All is arable land. There are 3 ancient forts in the td., one towards the N. called Rathcornagh Fort. The road from Limerick to Galbally passes E. and W. across the townland, forming a cross of 4 roads about the centre, at which Cross Roads stands the small village of Spittle. In the S. of the td. is a neat house called Coolcormick House.
