

DEATHS.

On Saturday last, the 10th inst. after a few days illness, Mrs. Lyons, of Leicestown, county Westmeath, wife of John C. Lyons, Esq. and the only sister of Hugh M. Tuite, Esq. of Soona. Possessed of a mind of no mean order, and in early life a contributor to some of the leading literary magazines of the day, she was eminently distinguished for her goodness of heart and the sincerity of her friendship, and is now much lamented by her numerous acquaintances, but more particularly by the poor of Mullingar and its neighbourhood, to whose necessities she at all times freely contributed.
