The Grand Jury of the County of Dublin have re-
turned public thanks to John Arthure, Esq. High Sher-
riff of that county, for the excellent manner in which
he has discharged the various duties of that office the
past year.

KILKENNY, Feb. 16.—On Wednesday evening, the
commission business terminated in this City.—The fol-
lowing are the only prisoners who were tried:—

John Quinlan was indicted on several capital felonies,
chiefly under the White Boy Act—for assembling
with others and attacking the dwelling house of James
Kennealy, at Ashdown, a tenant on the estate of the
Earl of Besborough; for administering unlawful oaths;
sending threatening letters to farmers, to compel them
to give up their lands—with firing shots into and break-
ing the house of said Kennealy, &c. &c. The several
facts charged in the indictments were most clearly
proved. The Jury retired but for a few minutes,
and brought in a verdict of GUILTY, on the entire char-
ges. The prisoner was ordered to be executed on
Thursday next, at the Countess's Bush, near the place
where those outrages were committed.

John Egan capitally indicted, and convicted, for
other felonies, under same Act; and also of carrying
away by force the daughter of a respectable Farmer
in this County, with intent to marry or defile her.—
He was sentenced to be hanged on Saturday, the 23d
inst. at Callan.
