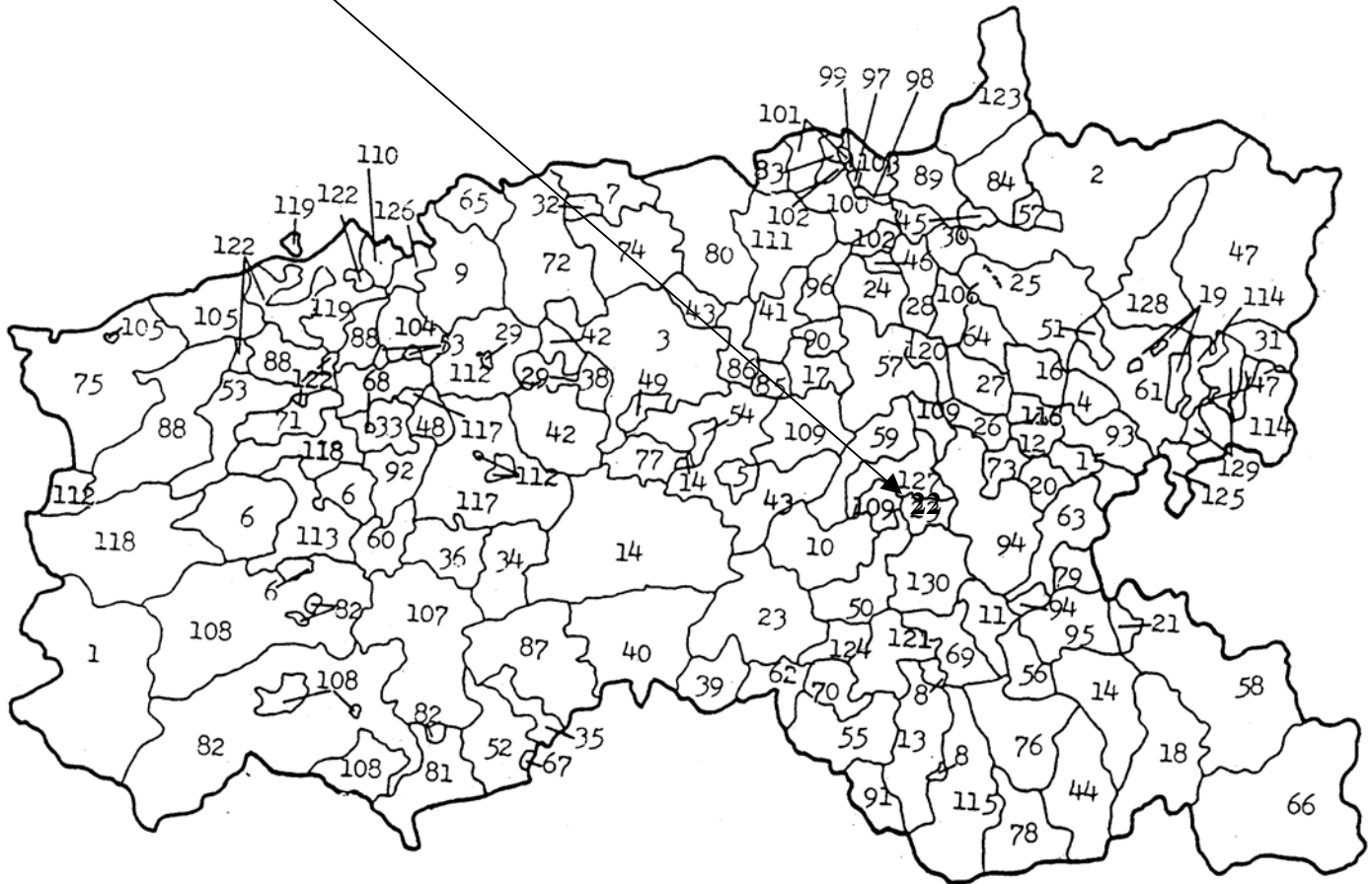

The property of F. Bevan, Esq., Camass, Co. Limerick. Contains 140 a. 3 r. 7 p., including about 18 a. of bog; remainder arable land. In the W. side of the townland is an ancient fort.

Bounded on the N. by the tds of Ballydaheen, Ballycampion and Newtown; on the E. by the parish of Knockaney; On the S. by parish of Uregare and the tds. of Ardykeohane and Brackvoan; and on the W. by the tds. of Brackvoan and Galbally, and the parish of Monasteranenagh.

The property of Lord Limerick, England, containing 398 a. 2 r. 39 p. of arable land. In the S. of the td. is part of the village of Bruff. Also, in the S. is a fort, and in the N.E. is another fort, in which is a Trigl. Station called Bruffhill. In the S.E. of the td. is Prospect Hill House.

The property of F. Bevan Esq., Camass, County Limerick. Contains 143 a. 2 r. 9 p. of arable land. In the E. boundary of this townland is part of the Village of Bruff. In the S. part is a burial ground.

This court is in ruins. Scarcely any portions of the walls are now standing, except the south end, which is now the side of a house thatched with straw.
