A thousand barrels of the flour lately
from New York, were sent off last week
to the pool, as no bounty was to be obtained
import into any of the ports of this coun-
try, of which were exported on
the day before. His Majesty's illness unfortu-
nately prevented the bill for such an encourage-
ment which was recently in progress in the Im-
parliament, from being now in operation.

His Majesty has been pleased to mention that large quanti-
ties of Chester and Gloucester Cheeses have re-
cently arrived, which, by the new regulations,
are to be sold at a duty as heretofore, and therefore ought
to be sold at a price.—Garden and grass-seeds, with
bags of peas and beans, are also arriving,
and the former are now exempted from
duty. To these we will add cider, beer, and
wine, which however pay the like duties as formerly.

On the 15th inst. a Proclamation was issued by
His Majesty and Council, to continue
the free entry into the ports
of all rice, India corn, and all kind
of flour.—Another Proclamation issued,
to continue till 1st June next, the
prohibition of the further distilling of spirits from
malt, barley, bere, or any other species
—and also the exportation of any rice
to foreign parts from any port or
place in this kingdom.

The 1st Day, from Bladeford for Limerick,
arrived at Limerick the 9th March.

On Wednesday night, the Rev. Mr. Dickson's
two Proctors, went to Killkeedy, in this County,
to collect some Tythes due last year; they re-
mained in a Public House at that place till seven
o'clock—in about two hours after their depar-
ture, from 1 to 200 fellows, armed with guns,
pistols, and swords, and mounted on Horses,
which they took from the neighbourhood of
Mungret, broke into said House, in search of
the Proctors, who fortunately had escaped their
fury by going to Limerick; after being thus dis-
appointed, the banditti went to the House of a
Man who had given evidence on a Trial at a late
Court-Martial, and Whipped him most cruelly.

About the hour of 2 o'clock last night, a Sol-
dier of the 1st Battalion of the 26th Regt. going
to his barracks at Park, was shot through the left
thigh, by some villain unknown, when wounded
he observed three men make off on the bank, who
were immediately pursued by the Regiment, but
without effect.
