He served during the seven years' war, and got his company in 1763. He served in America under Sir W. Howe, and remained in that country, under Lord Cornwallis, until the capitulation of the British army, when he returned to England. The first regiment he got was the 81st Foot, in 1798. He served on the staff in Ireland during the rebellion of that time, and commanded at the battle of New Ross, where he had two horses shot under him. He was afterwards appointed Governor of Ross Castle. In 1818 he was created a Baronet, and next year got the 5th Regiment.
