On Saturday evening, between 8 and 9 o'clock, James  
Hickey, of Inch-St.-Laurence, was assaulted near  
Cahirnarry, in the Liberties of Limerick. It appears  
that the unfortunate man, in company with his father and  
uncle, were returning from this City, where they disposed  
of six pigs, when five fellows met them on the high road  
convenient to Ardmore Turnpike, when they fractured  
the skull and trampled on the body of young Hickey,  
and, after robbing old Hickey of £1. 15s. beat him so  
unmercifully, that they left him supposed for dead. A  
hue-and-cry having been raised, Serjeant Chillingworth  
and Constable Rahilly, of the County Police, stationed  
at Ballyneety, instantly went in search of all suspected  
persons, and we are happy to find succeeded in appre-  
hending three men, named Michael Hickey, Michael  
Rocha, and Patrick Conside. Intimation of the  
outrage having been received by the Mayor, he, with  
Captain Drought, Sheriff Fieley, and the City Police,  
proceeded there at an early hour on Sunday morning,  
and a deliberate investigation having taken place at the  
Coroner's Inquest, the three men secured by Serjeant  
Chillingworth were fully committed for trial at the ensu-  
ing Assizes, on a charge of the murder and robbery.—  
The three men were clearly identified by the two surviving  
Hickeys as the perpetrators. Major Wilson and Captain  
Wilson assisted at the Inquest, and on Monday appre-  
hended some other persons, on suspicion of being con-  
cerned in this most atrocious affair.

A most desperate attack was made on Sunday night  
last, on a man of the name of Walsh, residing on the
