CORK ASSIZES.

Mag. Records were disposed of in the City

Mannix—This was an action by the widow of the late Mr. Thomas Mannix, against the Defendant, to recover 175l. 4s. 8d. Bill of Costs due to Plaintiffs' husband—Plaintiff, subject to taxation, 61l. 3s. 2d. 6d. costs.

Lord Middleton, v. Connell—This was an action for the title of lands of Ringaskiddy, the property of Viscount Middleton—Verdict for the Plaintiff in the direction of Court, 6d. damages, and 6d.

Convictions continued from our last:—

John Kelly, for a rape on Judith Kelly, at Kanturk, May last.—The prosecutrix was wife to a man who was assaulted by the prisoner and others in the fair of Kanturk, and the woman was injured and abused. No evidence was called against the prisoner, a very young man, who was sentenced to death, after a very impressive trial by Baron Pennefather. John Geehan, for

stealing a quantity of lead off the Ordnance Barracks, at Kanturk, on the 3d of February—12 months imprisonment and 6 to hard labour. Mary Neill, for stealing a quantity of worsted from John Beck of Bandon; sentenced to 6 months imprisonment and 6 to hard labour. Florence O'Connell, for stealing a quantity of property of the late Mr. O'Connell, near Bandon, 7 years transportation.

Patrick Barry, for the murder of Patrick O'Malley—manslaughter—4 months imprisonment. Edward Jennings, a well-dressed man, was indicted for obtaining 18l. from Michael O'Connell by threats and false pretences, and representing himself as Agent to Mr. James Byrne of Carrigrohane, a prisoner was convicted but not sentenced.

Thomas Kelly, for robbing George Evans of his cows. Acquitted.

John Kelly, for the rape on Julian Keily, and Egan for attacking James Wallis, have been ordered for Execution on Saturday the 9th of April.

County Cork Record Court, on Monday, Earl of Devon, as Executors of Aldworth, an action was brought for the lapidation of a farm in breach of a deed of entail. After a long investigation, a verdict was given for the Plaintiff, 2,300l. damages, and 6d. costs.—

Plaintiff—Messrs. Bennett, Furlong and O'Brien, Counsel for Defendant—Messrs. Goold, Stack, and Freeman. Sir James G. G. was foreman of the Jury.

Great activity is apparent in procuring signatures to the Petitions to Parliament for and against the Water Works Bill, and both are respectably and numerously signed.

Notwithstanding the evil repute in which the Shannon water was held forth by some few advocates of the Water Works Bill at the late Meeting, it has been now incontrovertibly established that it really possesses a greater degree of purity than five other species of water, all of which have been analysed this week by Medical Gentlemen.—Equal and separate portions of each were taken and enclosed in glass phials, to which a suitable chemical process was applied, sufficient to affect their respective qualities, when it was proved that the Shannon water, to which even a more powerful test was administered than to the others, deposited an infinitely smaller sediment of lime than any of the rest. The six sorts upon which the experiment was tried were, the Pennywell water, Palmerstown water, Tubber na Sashree water, Shannon water, pump in Bedford-row, and rain water, next to which (rain water) the Shannon was the purest.

On Saturday last, a man of the name of Edward Hurley, a very honest and industrious person, was found dead at Rusheen bog; on being searched, there was 14s. a bead, and a key found in his pockets. An Inquest was held on the body by James Bennett, Esq. Coroner for this County, when the Jury returned a verdict of—"Died by the visitation of God."—The money, &c. found on the deceased's person, were handed to his son.

John Ring, a private of the 75th Regiment, died at the barracks in Fermoy on Monday, from a blow of the spindle of a bucket.

A respectable farmer from Corcomore fell from his horse at Cunnigar, near this City, on Sunday night, but his life was preserved by the exertions of the two police stationed at that post.

An atrocious outrage was committed on Tuesday night, at Carrigrohane, near Cork—a fine cow belonging to a poor industrious farmer named Murphy, was houghed with a scythe, and the inhuman monsters actually cut off the two hind quarters while the poor animal was alive!

On Saturday, a young lad named Burgess, son to the Postmistress of Bandon, was committed to Cork jail, for opening and extracting money from letters before their delivery.

In the County Cork Court a farmer had his pocket picked on Saturday of 2l. 10s. but the offender made off; and on the same evening, the Rev. Mr. Falvey, P. P. Chaplain to the City Jail, had his pocket picked of a silk handkerchief by a noted offender, who was detected.

This morning, Mary Carroll, a convict under sentence of transportation, was transmitted from the County Jail to the Richmond Penitentiary, Dublin.

A communion-cloth was this morning stolen from the altar of St. Mary's Chapel, by some sacrilegious wretch. The house of a man named Keugh, near Waterford, was attempted to be maliciously burned last night.

At Down Assizes, Mr. Cooper, woollen-draper, of Donaghadee, recovered 29l. damages and costs from Mr. Waugh, of the same business, for slanderous expressions.
