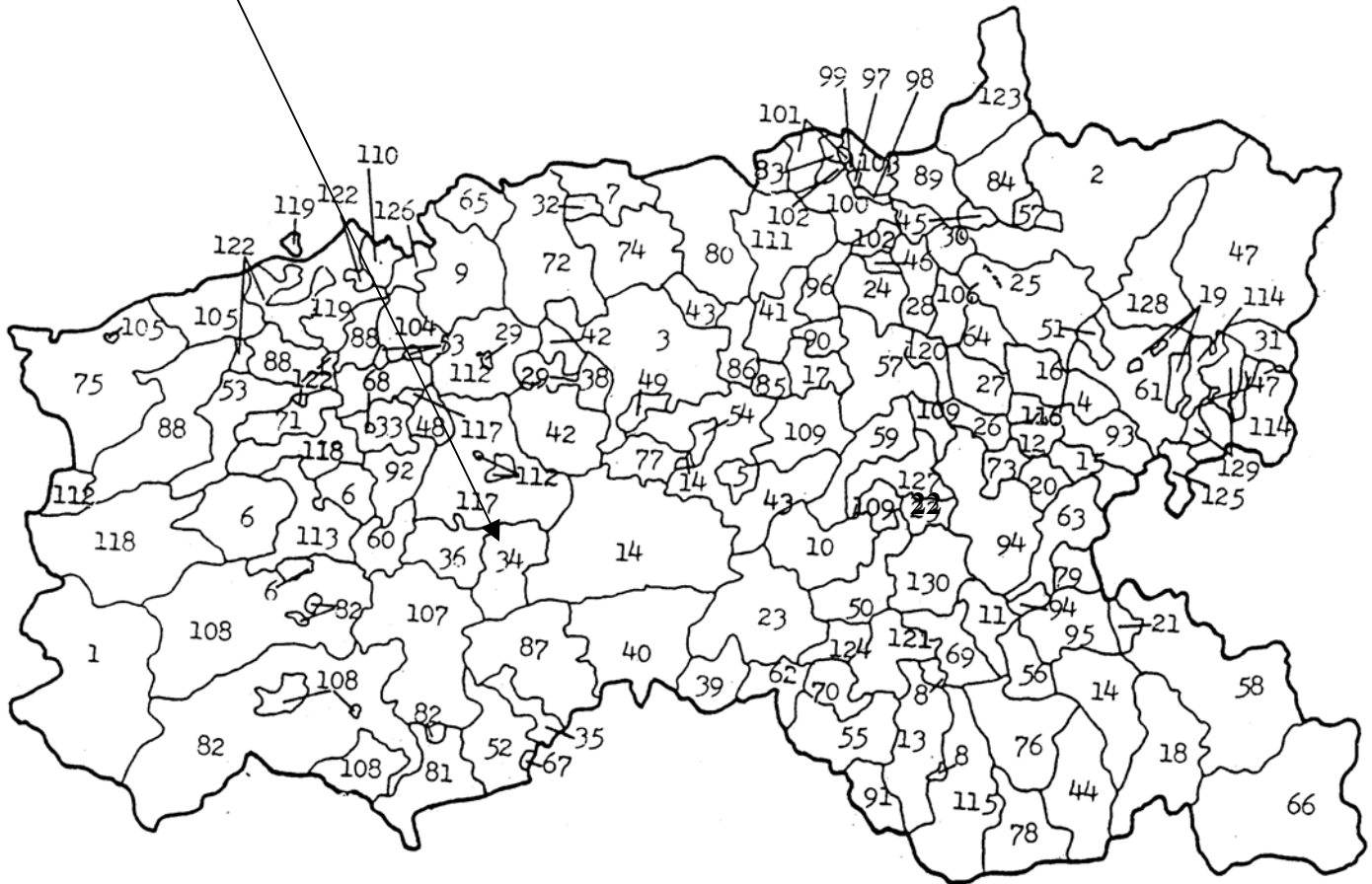

This parish is situated in the southern part of the county. It is bounded on the N. by Rathkeale ph.; on the W. by the phs. of Clonelty and Kilmeedy; and on the S. by Kilmeedy parish. It contains 4,543 acres, statute measure.

This parish is well cultivated. The land is chiefly arable ground and pasture; but runs up on the south among the skirts of the great mountain-district which occupies the borders of Limerick and Kerry. There is also some high ground along the northern boundary. There are only two principal roads traversing the parish.

It is the property of Lord Clare, and is under tillage and pasture except for about 40 acres of mountain pasture skirting the southern boundary. Two bye-roads pass through the townland, and near its southern boundary is an ancient fort. Acreable rent - £1.

This is a large holy well, at which Stations are performed on Saturday nights. It is celebrated for curing blindness.

This is a holy well in the td. of Cloncagh.

Lady's Well      -- Local      22

Tobar Mhuire, well of the Virgin Mary. O'D.

 A kind of redoubt on the brow of a small hill.
