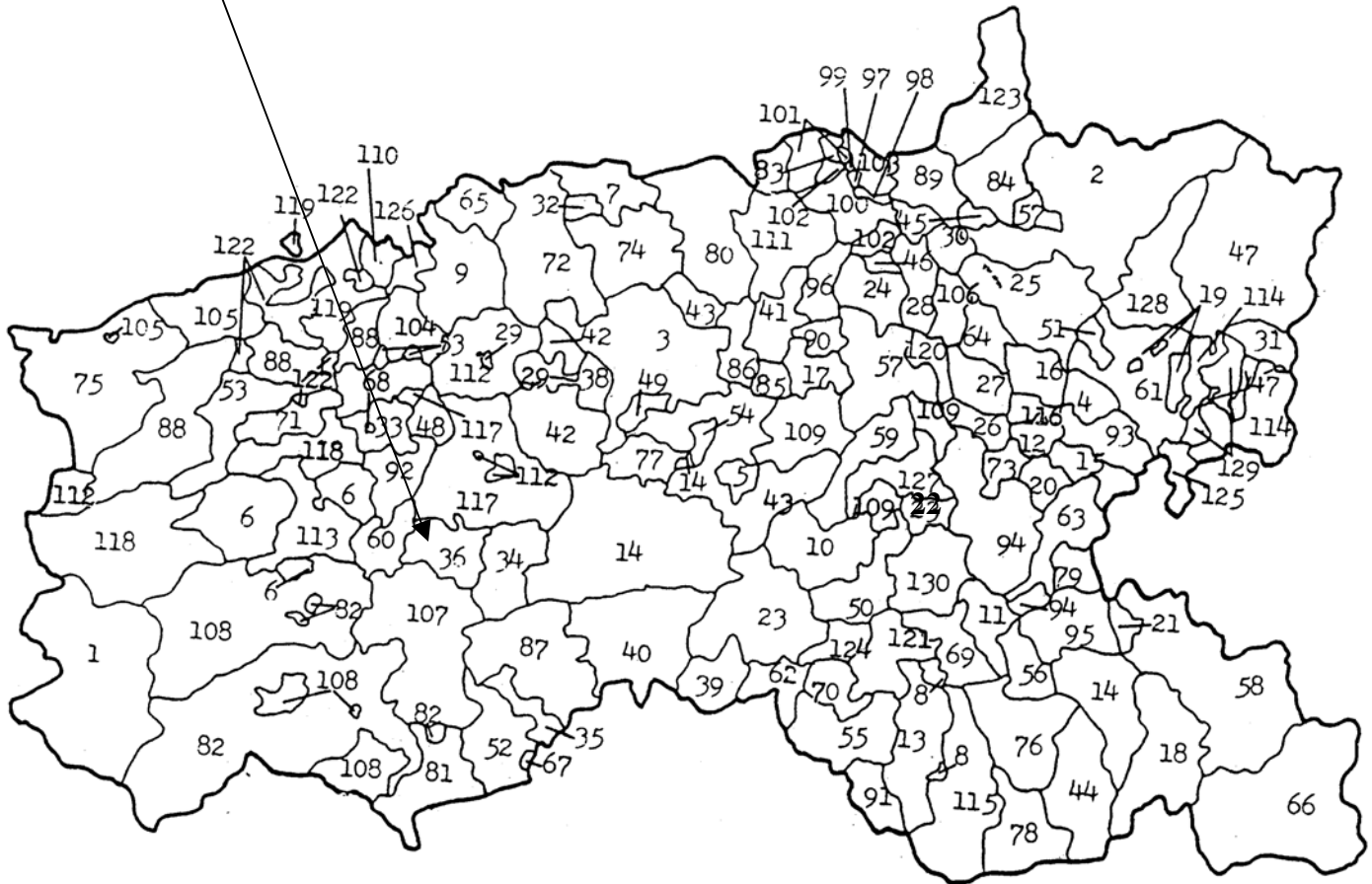

This parish is situated about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of Newcastle and $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Rathkeale. It is bounded on the N. by Rathkeale ph.; on the E. by Cloncagh ph.; on the S. by Mahoonagh ph.; and on the W. by Grange parish. It contains 3,748 acres, statute measure.

It is the property of sundry Gentlemen, as described in the several townlands. It is under tillage and pasture, except for a few portions of rough pasture. The road from Newcastle to Ballingarry passes through its northern extremity, and on this road is the village of Knockaderry. There are two Gentlemen's seats with some plantations in this ph., and the road from Knockaderry village to Kilmeeby passes S.E. through it.

In the N.E. part of the parish, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east of Knockaderry Village. It is bounded on the N. by Ballybrown td. and the ph. of Rathkeale; E. by the ph. of Cloncagh; S. by Kilgolban td.; and W. by the td. of Kiltanna. It contains 565 acres, st. measure.

This townland is the property of Robert Featherston,

Esq., and has a few portions of heathy pasture in its S. and S.W. extremity. The remainder of the td. is under tillage and pasture. Aughalin Wood is on its N.W. boundary, and the road from Knockaderry to Ballingarry passes south of this wood through the townland. There are also three ancient forts in this townland, one of which is on its southern boundary. Acreable rent - £1 7s.

In the N. of the parish, about $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles from Rathkeale. It is bounded on the W., the N., and the E. by the ph. of Rathkeale and the Glebe of Ballybrown; and on the S. by the tds. of Aughalin and Kiltanna. Contains $136\frac{1}{2}$ acres.

Is the property of Thomas Locke, Esq. It is all under tillage and pasture, and Ballybrown Glebe is situated on its eastern boundary. Acreable rent - £2 4s.

In the S.S.E. end of the parish, nearly 1 mile south of Knockaderry Village. It is bounded on the N. by Filgolban td.; E. by Cloncagh ph.; S. by the ph. of Mahoonagh; and W. by Mahoonagh ph, and the tds. of Rathfreedy, Lissaniska E., and Kiltanna. It contains 666 acres.

Is the property of the Court of Exchequer. Arable and pasture, with a portion of rough pasture adjoining the road from Knockaderry Village to Kilmeedy, which road forms the northern boundary of the townland. A river, called the Owenskaw, forms the eastern boundary, on which are a Tuck Mill and a bridge called after the townland. Clonelty old church and Ballyno old castle are also in this townland. Acreable rent - £2.

Situated $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S.S.E. of Knockaderry Village. It is bounded on the N. by Kiltanna and Aughalin tds.; E. by Cloncrew ph.; and S. and W. by the td. of Ballynoe. Contains 414 acres, st. measure.

There are a few portions of rough pasture in the eastern and south-eastern extremities of the townland; the remainder is very good tillage land. A road from Knockaderry to Ballingarry and Kilmeedy villages forms its southern

boundary. There are also two ancient forts in its eastern extremity. Acreable rent - £2 6s.

The property of Wellington Rose, Esq. There are some portions of rough pasture in the S.E. extremity of the td. and a small portion of same on the S. boundary; the remainder is arable and pasture. A road from Knockaderry to Ballingarry passes through its northern extremity, and a fort stands on its southern boundary. Lissnamacauv Fort is in this td. Acreable rent - £1 10s.

This townland is situated in the N.W. end of the parish, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.5.W. from Rathkeale. It is bounded on the N. and E. by Rathkeale ph.; on the S. by the tds. of Kiltanna, Lissaniska E., and Lissaniska W.; and on the W. by Grange ph. It contains 706 acres.

It is the property of Major Sullivan under James Darcy Evans, Esq. Arable and pasture, with a small portion of rough pasture in the N.W. extremity. Knockaderry Village is near its S.E. boundary, from which the road to Rathkeale passes northwards, and another goes to Newcastle West. On its west boundary is a good house, with a garden, plantation

Situated about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Knockaderry Village.

It is bounded on the N. by Lissaniska E. td.; on the E. by Ballynoe td.; on the S. by the ph. of Mahoonagh; and on the W. by Lissaniska E. td. Contains 268 acres.

This td. is the property of Thomas Cullinan, Esq. It is entirely under tillage and pasture. The road from Knockaderry Village to Kilmeedy forms its N.E. boundary, and another to Dromcolliher Village forms its S.W. boundary. There are two forts in its S.S.W. extremity. Rathfreedy Trigl. Station stands on another fort in its northern extremity.

Situated about 3 miles N.E. of Newcastle. Bounded on the N. by Knockaderry td.; E. by the tds. of Kiltanna & Ballynoe; S. by Rathfreedy td. and Mahoonagh ph.; and W. by the tds. of Lissaniska W. and Knockaderry. Contains 328 acres.

This td. is the property of Lord Chief Baron O'Grady. There is a small portion of rough pasture on its eastern boundary; the remainder is under tillage and pasture. The road from Knockaderry to Kilmeedy passes through, and also forms part of, its southern boundary; and S.S.E. from this road another road turns S.S.W. to Dromcolliher, forming also a part of its southern boundary. There are four forts in this townland. Acreable rent - £1 14s.

This td. is situated in the S.W. end of the parish. It is bounded on the N. and E. by the tds. of Knockaderry and Lissaniska East; on the S. by Mahoonagh ph.; and on the W, by Grange ph. It is $\frac{3}{4}$ mile S.W. of Knockaderry Village, and contains 292 acres.

It is the property of Thomas Locke, Esq, and consists of arable land and pasture, having 3 forts in it. The fort nearest its southern boundary has a well in it, called Tubbermeeda, and N.E. of this fort is a limestone quarry. Acreable rent - £2.
