

FEATHARD.

REPORT upon the PROPOSED MUNICIPAL BOUNDARY of the BOROUGH of FEATHARD.

THE ancient Limits of Feathard are supposed to enclose about 1,800 Statute Acres. The Boundary is ill defined. ANCIENT LIMITS.

Feathard is a very ancient Town in the County of Tipperary ; it is a very unimportant one in the present day ; it has a Medicine Dispensary, but no Fever Hospital for the Poor. DESCRIPTION OF
THE TOWN.

The Population, according to the Census of 1831, amounts to 3,405. Population.

The only Local Tax levied here appears to be that most unproductive one called Market and Fair Tolls. The Feathard Tolls this year are set for about 25*l*. The whole yearly collection is estimated at 50*l*. Local Rates.

The County Rate levied upon the Borough of Feathard is one-three-hundred and-twelfth part of the amount laid upon the County "at large." County Rate.

The acreable Rate upon the Lands of Feathard, laid on at the Spring and Summer Assizes of 1835, is 2*s*. 5*d*. per acre ; and the actual amount of Rates laid upon Feathard in 1835, was 99*l*. 6*s*. 3*d*.

The following is the proposed Boundary :—

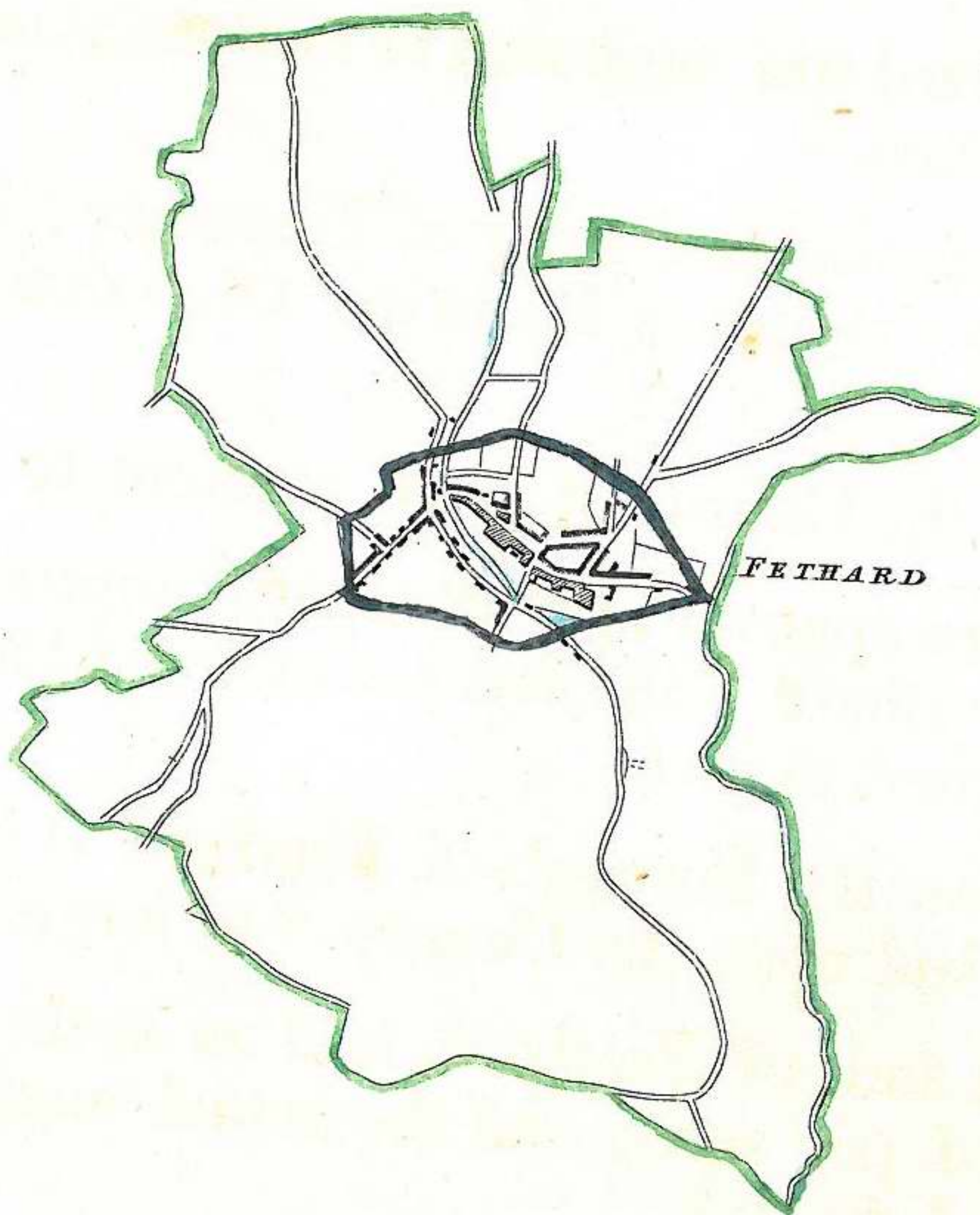
The Boundary commences at a Point (1) in the Kilnoul Road where a Bank runs North-westerly, which Point is about One hundred and twenty Yards to the Southward of the Place where the Saussestown Road meets the Kilnoul Road ; thence, Westerly, along said Bank, crossing the Stry-lea Bye-road, and going to the North-east Angle of the Barrack Field enclosing Wall (2) ; thence, Westerly, along said Wall to where it turns South (3) ; thence, South, along Wall about Eighteen Yards to (4) where it turns Westerly ; thence, Westerly, along said Wall to its North-west Angle (5) ; thence, Westerly, along a low Wall to the West Pier of a Gate on the Gracetown Road (6), about Two hundred and ten Yards Northerly from the old Town Gate of Chapel Lane ; thence about Twenty Yards North-westerly to the South Pier of a Gate (7) on the West side of Gracetown Road, from which Pier a Bank runs South-westerly ; thence, South-westerly, along said Bank, about One hundred and fifty Yards, till it reaches (8) the North-east Angle of a Stone Wall enclosing the "Still Field ;" thence in a straight Line and South-westerly direction to the Point on the Cashel Road, opposite the South-west Angle (9) of the Watering "Pond" or River Creek on the Road side, near John Burn's House ; thence along a Bank and dry Wall running South-westerly from John Burn's House for about One hundred and five Yards to the top of "Kircum Burbush" Hill (10), where it is met by another Bank and dry Stone Wall running North-west ; thence continuing in the former South-west direction along Bank for about Forty-four Yards (11) where Bank turns to the South-eastward ; thence, South-easterly, along Bank for about Seventy Yards, where it is met by a Bank running to the South-west (12) ; thence, South-westerly, along Bank till it reaches an old Pier (13) within a few feet of the East side of "Red City" Road, about One hundred and seventy Yards North-westerly of the Point where said Road joins the old Clonmel Road ; thence in a straight Line and Southerly direction to the centre of the East Arch of Garench Bridge on the old Clonmel Road ; thence along the Garench Rivulet till it falls into the Glashall (14) ; thence along the Glashall Stream to the Point (15) near Cramp's Bridge, where it unites with the Saussestown Stream ; thence to the centre of the Eastern Arch of Cramp's Bridge (16) ; thence in a straight Line to the Point first described. 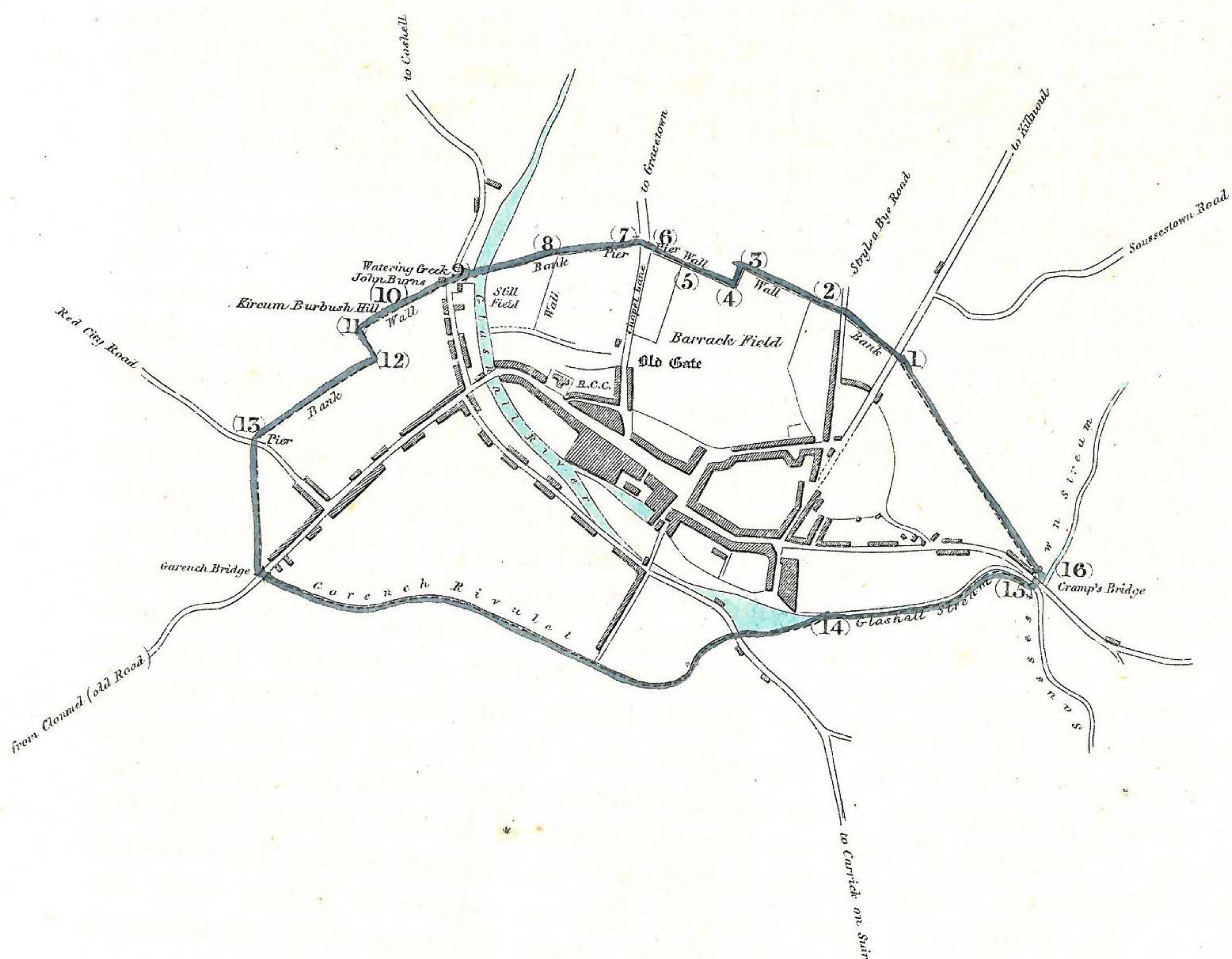
The Ancient Boundary from the Report of the Municipal Commissioners & Local Enquiry.
