Extract of a Letter from St. Vincent, Jan. 22.
"The harmony of Grenada is changed into discord and anarchy, which prevail in every walk and sphere of life, from the highest magistrate to the lowest, and infomuch, that a Governor's arrival is prayed for by all sober and well-disposed people; we of this island are trembling for fear of bad effects from the Caribbees, who most certainly communicate with the rebels of Dominica.

"Those rebels amount to near 530 men, we'll supplied with guns and ammunition and money. They offer dollars and French money for the provisions they purchase; every attempt made by the military have failed of any success against them. The French supply them with the necessary implements of war. The Unicorn man of war has seized a vessel in Prince Rupert's Bay in Dominica, which cleared out from Guadaloupe, and was loaded with ammunition. The French emissaries at work, and the English inattention to the situation of these ceded islands, will be fatal when least expected."

By the last accounts from India, we hear that Colonel Lamont, of the 73d regiment, in a fit of insanity, flung himself over board from a ship in Calcutta river, and was drowned.

Early this morning the Right Hon. the Attorney General left town, in order to attend the assizes, on Monday next, at Castlebar, and to conduct the prosecutions against the persons charged with the late atrocious murders in the county of Mayo.

The Duke of Leinster, Lords Mountmorres, Charlemont, Carhampton, Farnham, Mountgarret, Desert, and Powerscourt, have entered their protest against the Police-Bill.

The operation of the Police-Bill will not take place until September next; the intermediate time will be employed in preparing the houses of correction, constructing the judiciary offices, and other necessary arrangements.

An order it is said is arrived for the embarkation of two regiments of foot at Cork, for the West-Indies.

Last Tuesday the two centinels who were on duty at Kilmainham goal on the day the felons escaped, received as a punishment for their inattention, 500 lashes each in the Royal Square at the Barracks. Five of the runaways are now secured in their former habitation, one of them came in yesterday of his own accord, after having enlisted with a recruiting party, in company with which he landed in his city the day before.
