The Robbery committed lately on the Rev. Mr. Fitzpatrick, of Stephen street Chapel, is a further instance of the depravity of the times. John Austin had often put those nightly desperadoes to the rout, by announcing to them his name; and by thundering into their ears the dreadful judgments which hovered over them, unless they repented, and desisted from such lawless and barbarous proceedings.
