

The High Sheriff has received a respite for Timothy Callaghan, against whom sentence of death was recorded at the late County Assizes for female violation.

The death warrant has been received for the execution at the County Gaol on Saturday, of Daniel Molony, Mathew Molony, and Jeremiah O'Donnell, found guilty at last Assizes of conspiring and attempting to murder Thadeus R. Ryan, of Castlejane, Esq.

A written notice was posted on Thomond-gate Distillery yesterday morning, threatening any person that would take potatoe ground from Andrew Hickie.

The Mayor having held an inquest upon the body of Daniel Connelly, who died in the County Infirmary of injuries he received the night his farm-house was set on fire and burned, near Castlegarde, in the parish of Doone, as related in our last, the Jury found a verdict of wilful murder against several persons, one of whom, John Carthy, is in custody. The above party would, it appears, have immolated husband, wife and children, in the same conflagration which destroyed their dwelling and property, but for a stranger passing the road, who successfully struggled to rescue the intended victims from the flames. Connelly's widow is still in Hospital, suffering from the wounds she received upon that occasion.

An atrocious murder was committed in the neighbourhood of Bilboa, on Saturday night last, a man of the name of James Hayes, having been the unhappy victim. Himself and brother-in-law were in company, having left his house together in the evening, and Hayes was not seen or heard of until Sunday night, when his distracted wife found the body of her murdered husband near a stream, within less than a mile of their habitation. There is yet no account of the perpetrators of this foul deed.

Monday night last, a man of the name of Hayes met an acquaintance of the name of Mulcahy, in the fair of Cappamore, and offered to shake hands with him. Mulcahy said he was afraid of him as they had had a quarrell at a hurling match about two years since. Immediately on this Hayes stood aside and made a blow of a loaded whip at Mulcahy, which struck him, and the man lies insensible ever since, and is in great danger.

Denis M'Carthy, a farmer, was murdered on the evening of the late fair-day of Buttevant, while escorting another man home from the fair. He was beat to death on the road with sticks and stones. The Coroner's Jury have returned a verdict of wilful murder against five persons, three of whom are in custody. Deceased was a man of good character, in the employ of James Harrold Barry, Esq. and only married last Shrovetide to an interesting young woman.

Sunday night the dwelling-house of Gerald Connors, at Clounties, near Shanagolden, and a quantity of hay his property were maliciously burned by incendiaries. The only cause assigned for this outrage, is that Connors took a few acres of land convenient to his farm.

Two farm-houses on the lands of Ballyphillip, in this County, recently out of lease, have been maliciously burned to the ground.
