Special Weekly Dairy Market.

Tuesday, April 3rd.—The numbers on sale registered a seasonable gathering; a fair proportion of both heifers and cows. As the season advances, the supply of the former naturally is tightening, but correspondingly the requirements of dairy proprietors are not as pressing as earlier in the season. The entry was of a mixed character, lacking evenness of standard, with the result that trade lacked cohesion, and values, following class, were "up and down," which takes away from the swing of business. The attendance was not as large as previous market, as so many customers have been supplied. Still there was quite enough to buy readily useful and promising milkers, and pay top rates, as witness the best price for heifers obtained by Mr Michael Maher at £27 10s. The right stamp of young cows, five or six years old, command a strong demand, more could have been sold, clients did not quite fill up their numbers. Heifers lacking the dairy type and also rough and thin lots hard to place. Purchasers are quick to judge, and require what will prove a profitable investment. Business worked out with fair selling trade throughout the day. Comparatively the prices were on the basis of last week. Best, £24—£27 10s; promising, £20—£23 10s; ordinary, £15—£19.
