

At the City Magistrates Court, yesterday, informations were ordered against John, James, and Stephen Bonfield, and Michael Hickey, notorious robbers, the eldest of whom is not more than twelve years of age. Henry Green, for practising frauds on publicans, by calling for whiskey and not paying for it, 21 days imprisonment. James Byrnes and Geo. Jessy, vagrants, 14 days imprisonment.

John Meade, a witness examined at the inquest on the late Mary Hanly, and who first recognised her body, was so severely beaten on Monday night last as to endanger his life. It is believed that friends of Michael Hanly and Mary Fahy, charged with the murder of the above woman, committed this vindictive outrage.

Fourteen persons tried at petty sessions of Rathkeale, for petty larceny, were yesterday lodged in our county gaol.

The same functionary held an inquest at Kilmurry Archer, on the body of a child two years old, named Richd. O'Regan, who fell into a pool of water, and was drowned. Verdict according.
