Contains 6712 acres, st. measure. The parish in general is a mixture of arable and mountain, and there are roads through it in every direction and several small streams. Interspersed through it are several plantations of trees, a few ancient forts, and a number of neat houses. Ballinacourty House is situated in Ballinacourty Td., in the southern part of the parish.

Is the property of Frederick Bevan Esq., and contains 485 a 3 r. 24 p. st. meas. Nearly ½ the townland in the southern part is wood and mountain; the remainder is arable land. Somewhat to the N. of the td. there is a road bearing E. and W. across the td., and S. of this road, in the eastern part, stands Darragh House. east of which stand the ruins of Darragh Old Church in a graveyard. Interspersed there are several plantations.
