Derrigalvane Parish	Down Survey

Situated about 2 miles S.E. of the City of Limerick and in the Liverties. In two parts - one is bounded E. by the phs. of Carrigparson and Kilmurry; N. by Kilmurry Ph.; W. by St. Nicholas and Donaghmore Phs.; and S. by Cahernarry; the other is bounded E. & S. by Abbington Ph.; N. by Killeenagariff, and W. by Kilmurry Phs.

### Derrygalvin Ph. (contd.)

The first of these portions is about 2 miles long and 1 m. broad, with a road leading from Limerick to Tipperary through it. The other portion, which is about 4 miles from Limerick, is about 4 mile long and ½ mile broad, with a road through its centre leading from Limerick to Abbington. Both portions are level and chiefly cultivated lands, and contain 9 townlands.

Contains 147 acres which are arable. Soil partly deep, producing potatoes, corn, wheat and flax. The proprietor Michael T. Staunton, Esq. has it let per his agent Mr. David Fitzgerald to 7 tenants by leases of 2 lives at £4 per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly. Tithe 2/4 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

N.B. Part of this td., containing 123 acres, is called Ballysimon Staunton; the remaining part, containing 24 acres, is called Ballysimon Dickson.

Contains 38 acres, which are arable. Soil light, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor Saml. Dixon Esq. has it let per his agent Mr. Henry Hall to 6 tenants with leases of 1 life in farms of 12 to 2 acres at £3 3s. per acre. Neither Co. Cess nor tithe paid by this townland. Bog used for fuel is very scarce. Prevailing Names - McMahon.

The proprietor Pierce Mahony Esq. has it let to Mr. Jeremiah Shine (who has it in his own possession) by a lease of 1 life at £2 15s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly. Tithe 2/6 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Nolan by a lease of 1 life, and they again to 3 others on the same tenure and at £3 10s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly, and tithe 2/8 to 2s. per do. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Evans Esq. and others have it let per their agent Thos. Leahy Esq. to 2 tenants by leases expiring in 1846 at £1 12s. per acre, and they again for same term to 7 others at £5 5s. per acre. Co. Cess 4/6 to 6s. per acre, ½ yearly. Tithe 2/4 per do. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Fitzgerald to 4 tenants, 2 with leases of 1 life, at £2 9s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1/11 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

In the S.E. end of the parish, and bounded on the W. by Keyanna Td.: S. by Kishyquirk Td.: and N. by Killonan Td.

Contains 234 acres which are arable. Soil partly light, with some limestone, producing potatoes, corn, wheat and flax. The proprietor the Revd. Jno. Hutton has it let per his agent Thomas Russell Esq. to 15 tenants at will and at £1 10s. to £2 10s. per acre. County Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly and tithe 2/4 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce. The prevailing names are -McInerny.
