

PARISH OF DOONDONNELL – BARONY OF CONNELLO LOWER

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Situated 2 Eng. miles west of the town of Rathkeale. Bounded on the N. by Kilbradran Ph., N.E. by Nantinan, E. & S. by Rathkeale, W. by Clonagh, and N.W. by an isolated part of Rathkeale.

This Td. is bounded on the N.E. by a road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton, which is the boundary of the td. of Cloghanarold; on the E. and S. by Rathkeale Ph.; on the S.W. by Kilscannell Ph.; and on the N.W. by Riddlestown.

Is the property of James Fitzgerald Massy, Esq., and is entirely under tillage and pasture. On the N.E. boundary is a road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton.
