The Meeting held this day of the Cess Payers of the Barony of Lower Connelloe pursuant to the Statute in that behalf made, at the Sessions House in the Barony of Rathkeale, on Tuesday, the 28th April 1840: JOHN S. BROWN, of Castlebarrix, Esq. in the Chair.

That a Committee be appointed for the purpose of attending at the Road Sessions, and presenting if possible, the passing of all unnecessary bills, and that the committee do meet some time previous to the Road Sessions to investigate all objections for the repairs of roads, &c. &c.

NOTICE.

THE MAYOR having received many complaints from his Fellow-Citizens of the Mayor, at this warm season, of allowing DOGS to prowl about the Streets, begs to call public attention to the law. The numerous accidents, and distressing consequences, which result to Society from neglect of early precaution, render it imperative on the MAYOR to carry the Law into full execution. He therefore gives Public Notice, that all DOGS found in the Streets, not secured in the manner described underneath, will be taken up by the Constables and Police, and destroyed, and the Owners fined. The following is an extract from the Act of Parliament in force about Dogs;—
 "If any Person shall keep at large any Cur Dog, Mastiff, or Bull Dog, within Fifty Yards of any Public Road or Street, without a Log of Wood of the weight FIVE POUNDS attached to his Neck, such Person, for every such offence, shall forfeit the sum of Ten Shillings, and every Constable may kill such Dog."
