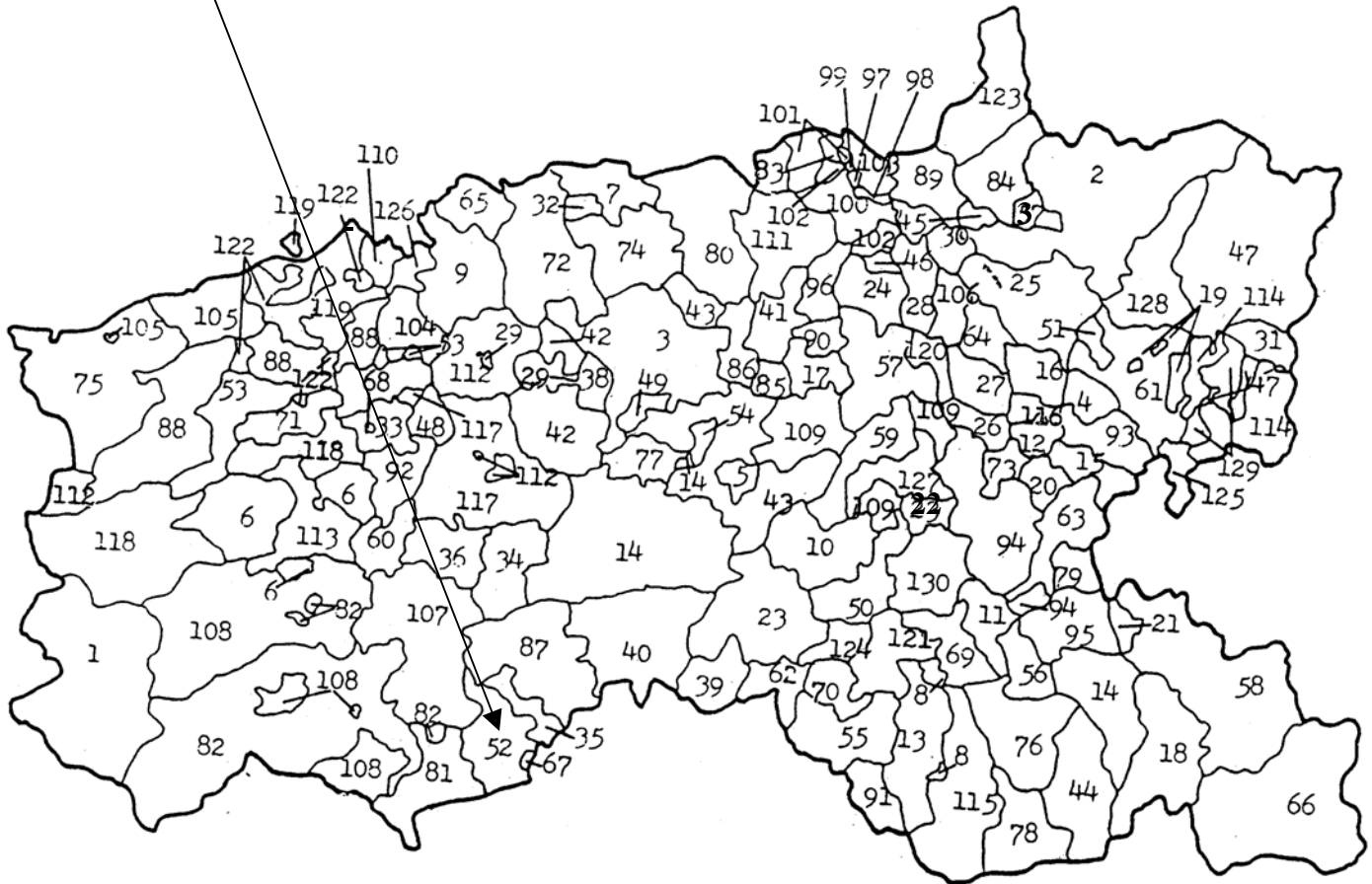

The N.W. point of this parish is situated about 9 miles S.S.E. of Newcastle Town. It is bounded on the N. by the phs. of Kilmeedy and Cloncrew; E. by Cloncrew Ph. and by Kilbolane Ph. in the Co. of Cork; S. by Kilbolane Ph., Co. of Cork, and by Tullylease, Co. of Limerick; and W. by the phs. of Killaghohane and Mahoonagh. Contains 4,846 acres, st. measure.

It is the property of sundry persons, and is all under tillage and arable, except a few portions of rough pasture. The Mail Car Road from Liscarrol to Newcastle passes through its south-western extremity, on which the town of Drumcullaher is built. There are a few Gentlemen's seats in this parish, together with Ballinlongig Wood, situated in its western extremity.

It is bounded on the N. by the tds. of Coolaboy and Kells and by Gorteens, a detached td. of the Ph. of Kilbolane in the Co. of Cork; E. and S. by Kilbolane Ph., in the Co. of Cork; and W. by the td. of Carroward West. Contains 224 acres.

It is the property of Robert Jonas Stavelly, Esq., and is all under tillage except a small portion of rough pasture on the N. Side. The Mail Car road from Liscarrol to Newcastle forms its S.W. boundary to the S.E. end of Srumcullaher Town. Acreable Rent - 18s. 5½d.

It is the property of Robert Jonas Stevelly, Esq., all arable land. The Mail Car road from Liscarrol to Newcastle forms part of its western boundary. On the east side of the road runs a stream, called Ahavarraga, and on the same side, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile from Drumcullaher Town, stands a small Corn Mill. Situated  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile N.E. of Drumcullaher Town. Contains 157 acres. It is bounded on the N. by Cloncrew Ph.; E. by Ballymongaun td.; S. by Cloncrew Ph. and the td. of Gardenfield Sth.; and W. by the td. of Gardenfield West.

It is the property of Robert Jonas Stevelly, Esq. Acreable Rent = £1. All arable land, except 2 small portions of rough pasture. A bye road runs from its southern boundary. There are 3 ancient forts here.

This townland is situated about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile S.E. of Drumcullaher Town. It is bounded on the S. by the td. of Carroward E.; W. by Coolaboy td.; N. by the tds. of Mundellihy and Gardenfield; and E. by Gardenfield and by Gorteens in the Ph. of Kilbolane, County of Cork. Contains 373 acres.

It is the property of Robert Jonas Stavelly, Esq. There is a portion of rough pasture in its S.E. end. A road from Drumcullaher to Ballygran passes through its southern extremity, and several bye-roads branch north through it. There are 2 fots, one W., and the other, a square one, E., of the road leading to Kilmeedy; and on the E. side of the latter fort, within 50 links of the road, stands a Trigl. It is bounded on the N. by Tulligmacthomas td. and Cloncrew Ph.; E. and S. by Cloncrew Ph. and by the tds. of East Gardenfield, south Gardenfield, Kells, Coolaboy and Woodfield; and W. by the td. of Ballinlongig and the ph. of Mahoonagh.

It is the property of Colonel White, and is all arable land. The Mail Car road from Charleville to Newcastle passes through its S.S.W. extremity, and a Corn and Tuck Mill stands near its most northern boundary, on the River Deel. There are several forts in the td., one of which is 80 links E. of a bye-road and is called Kyleballymartin, on which is a Trigl. Station. Acreable Rent - £1 4s. No leases.

This td. is the property of Colonel White, and is all arable land. The Mail Car road from Charleville to Newcastle passes through its western extremity. The river Deel forms its northern boundary.
