**SUICIDE IN THE WORKHOUSE**—Shortly after twelve o'clock, yesterday, Mr. Scott, Master of the Workhouse, reported to the Visiting Committee, Messrs. Walnutt, Cullen, and M'Carthy, that he had been informed by some of the inmates that the men selected by him to take charge of the Probationary ward, were seen to give out over the walls some of the paupers' old clothes which they had in charge. The accused, Sylvester Collopy, and John Harrold, were brought before the Board, when it was proved by one of the female inmates that previous to her entering the Workhouse she had received a shirt from Collopy under the gate, and that Harrold was present. With a view of punishing the delinquents, they were ordered by the Committee to be placed in the refractory ward, which is not more than 30 yards from the hall. Collopy was accordingly removed, but Harrold ran out through the back door, which was open at the time, but was pursued by the Master and some others, and was captured in a field adjoining the Rev. Mr. Walsh's house. He was conveyed back to the workhouse, and about to be placed in the refractory ward with Collopy, when, on opening the door, to the consternation of those present, Collopy was found suspended by the neck from two handkerchiefs, which he had contrived to fasten on the outside through the window, to a small bolt in the panel of the entrance. He was immediately taken down, and medical assistance rendered, but life was extinct! It is wonderful how he could have effected his purpose, as the height from the ground to the handkerchiefs round his neck, was not more than four feet, and he must have used great force to strangle himself, his feet being crippled on the ground. He is a married man, a native of this City, and 48 years of age. The Rev. Mr. Webb, Wesleyan Minister, and two ladies, were present when he was found suspended in this state. The Mayor held an Inquest this day, when a verdict was returned—"That his death was caused by suffocation, he having suspended himself by the neck from the door of a refractory cell in the Limerick Union Workhouse, where he was an inmate." Mr. John Scott, the Master, obviously requires a few trusty, active, paid assistants, as they have in Waterford, for it is morally impossible for him to oversee everything, at all hours, and in all parts, of this large establishment, and he cannot depend on unpaid, irresponsible servants.
