## ENNIS URBAN COUNCIL.

### Housing Question.

#### Bank Refuses Application for a Loan.

At the meeting of the Ennis Urban Council, Mr T. V. Honan, Chairman, presided.

There was a letter from Mr O'Riordan, Manager of the Munster and Leinster Bank, informing the Council that his directors had refused the application of the Council for a loan of £4,600 for the building of houses. He added that the period for repayment would render the advance prohibitive.

The letter was marked "read"

Availing of the provisions of the Building Facili- ties Act, as advertised by the Council, Miss Margaret Daly, Ennis, wrote applying for a grant of £120 to enable her to build a four-roomed house.

Mr Byrne mentioned the Council was not able to lend one penny having regard to their present financial position.

The Clerk, Mr Carmody, was directed to communicate with the Lend Bank to ascertain if the £120 could be borrowed by the council.

#### INCREASED RATE POUNDAGE.

Pursuant to notice, Mr McNamara moved that the poundage fees paid to Mr J Conidine, rate collector, be increased from sixpence to eightpence in the £. He said Mr Conidine had completed his collection satisfactorily.

The proposal was passed increasing the poundage to the amount referred to.

## SHANNON MYSTERY.

### Woman's Body Recovered.

The body of a woman named O'Dwyer, aged fifty-five years, was recovered from the Shannon at Corbally to-day by fishermen employed by the Lax Weir Fishing Company. The deceased, who was a married woman, had been missing from her home in the city for about a week, and was, it is stated, of rather eccentric habits. It does not transpire how she got into the water, but her death is presumed to be accidentally caused. The remains were removed by the Fire Brigade ambulance to Barrington's Hospital morgue, pending an inquest.
