FINES IMPOSED.

During last week four vendors of dirty eggs were prosecuted under the Agricultural Produce (Eggs) Act. In the same period two suppliers were prosecuted under the Dairy Produce Act for tendering to a creamery milk contained in dirty vessels ; and two farmers were prosecuted under the Live Stock Breeding Act for having unlicensed bulls. In all cases fines and costs were imposed.

Employes of Cork City egg stores are on strike. The employers proposed to reduce the wages of men from 61s. 6d to 55s., and of women from 35s. to 30s. for 47 hours' week, with one week's holidays and bank holidays, on the grounds that, owing to lower wages in competing districts, trade is being diverted from the city.
