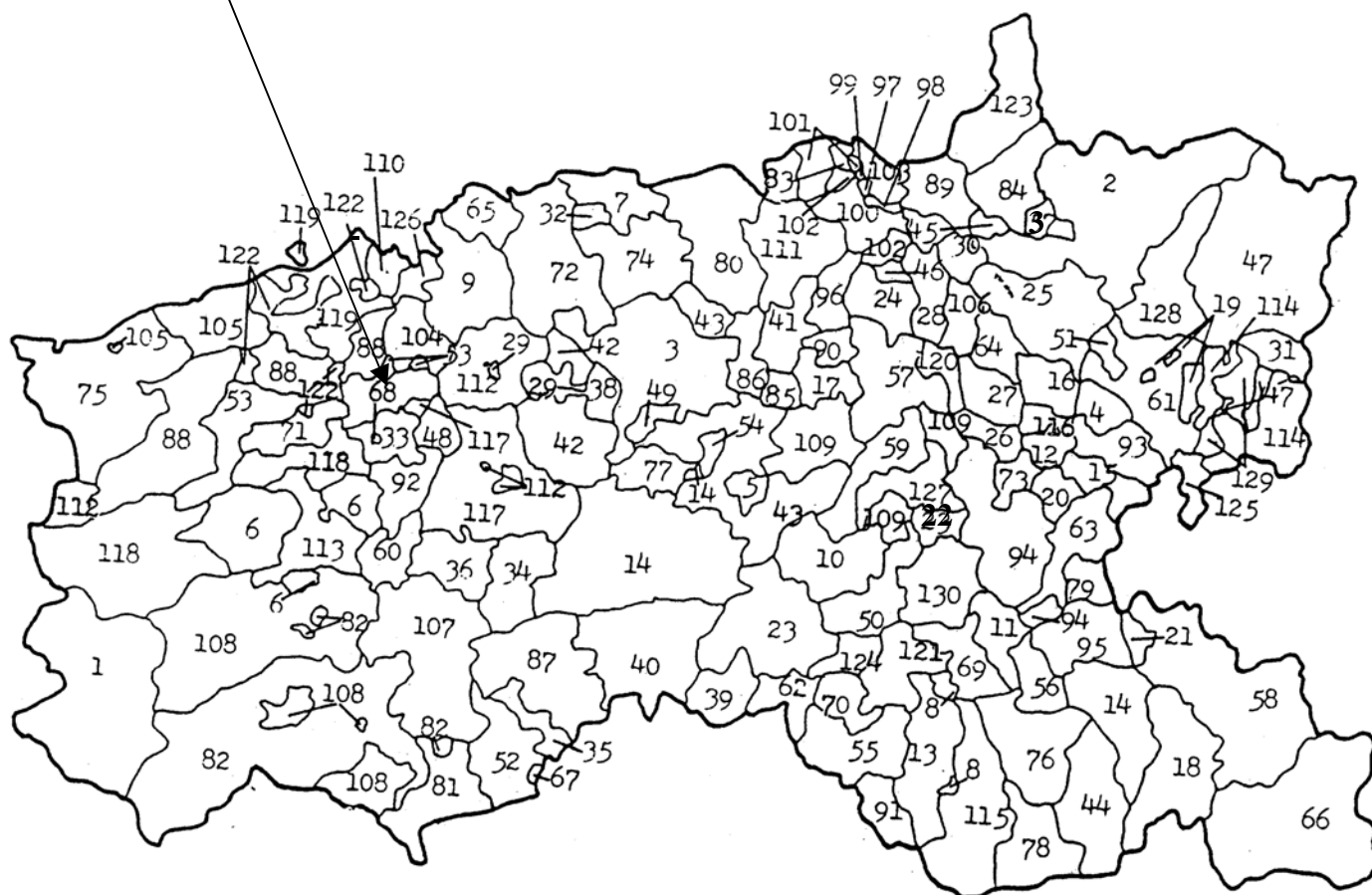

This parish is situated in the N.W. portion of the County of Limerick. It is bounded on the N. by the Phs. of Kilmoylean, Dunmoylean and Lismakeery; S. by Clonagh Ph.; E. by the Phs. of Lismakeery and Rathkeale; and W. by the Phs. of Rathronan, Kilcolman and Dunmoylean.

This parish is of an irregular form and contains a small detached portion of about 37 acres, which is situated in the Ph. of Clonagh, Barony of Connello Lower. Its area is 2,824 acres, statute measure. Its greatest length from N. to S. is 1 statute mile, and its greatest width from E. to W. is 3 miles 3 furlongs. This parish is situated on the western bank of the River Deel, over which is a good bridge, called Newbridge, built in 1747, when the road was first constructed. About  $\frac{1}{2}$  the parish is under tillage; the remainder is mostly made up of large dairy farms. The living is a rectory and vicarage in the Dio. of Limerick. At the foot of Kilbradran Hill stand the remains of the old church, and at Rathgonin are the remains of an old castle.

This Td. is situated in the East portion of the parish. It contains 238 acres, statute measure. There are 5 forts here.

It is the property of Thomas Studdert, Bunratty, Co. Clare, who lets to 11 tenants at will at from £1 0s. 6d. to £2 per acre. Co. Cess per acre yearly from 3s. 8d. to 5s. 8d. Tithe, £16 8s. 1d. on the entire townland. Size of farms - 2 acres to 26 acres. Soil light, producing wheat, oats and potatoes. Fuel scarce. Prevailing Names - Condon and O'Shaughnessy. There is a school, containing 35 boys and 25 girls, all Roman Catholics. The teacher is paid by the pupils. Quarterly terms - spelling 1s. 6d., reading and writing 2s., arithmetic 2s. 6d. The River Deel waters this townland, and contains trout and eel. The ruins of Ardlaman House stand here.

Cess per acre yearly from 3s. to 5s.8d. Tithe per acre from 1s.6d. to 2s.6d. Size of farms from 16 to 150 acres. Soil light, substratum limestone, producing wheat, oats and potatoes. Fuel scarce. Prevailing Names - Casey and O'Shaughnessy. There is a school house here, containing 40 boys and 30 girls, all Roman Catholics. Teacher paid by the pupils. Quarterly rates - spelling 1s.3d., reading and writing 2s., arithmetic 2s.6d. There are 306 acres in this townland.
