At Arthur's-quay, Mr. Thomas Fairnie, printer, a native of North Britain, and a young man generally regretted by the profession. On the 1st of July, at his residence, Duke-square, Parsonstown, sincerely and deservedly regretted by a numerous circle of relatives and friends, Lieut.-Colonel Moffatt, late of 33d Regiment. The Rev. Peter O'Neill, P.P. at the advanced age of 80 years—50 of which were spent in the active and zealous discharge of the duties of his ministry in the parish of Ballymacoda, county Cork.
