COUNTY COURT—YESTERDAY.

Baron Fitzgerald entered the County Criminal Court on yesterday morning at 10 o'clock, and a petty jury having been sworn, Catherine Leahy was given in charge for the murder of her infant on the 10th of March last at Ballingoola, in the suburbs of this city. The prisoner pleaded not guilty.

Mr. DeMoleyns, Q.C., and O'Hea conducted the case for the Crown, and Mr. Coffey defended the prisoner. The facts of this case were reported in the **CHRONICLE** at the time of its occurrence, and will be found detailed and commented on in Baron Fitzgerald's charge to the Grand Jury. The trial occupied a great portion of the day, and ended in an acquittal of the prisoner.

John Connors, a middle aged man, rather comfortably clothed, in the garb of a well-to-do small farmer, holding 12 acres of land, was indicted for stealing 7 sheep on the 6th June last, they being the property of Laurence Pheore of Creganstown. The prisoner pleaded not guilty.

Laurence Pheore, the owner of the sheep, deposed to his loss, but he afterwards regained them in the Pound in Doneraile.

On being cross-examined by the prisoner's counsel as to his means of identifying his sheep, he gave the following graphic, but not flattering account of his stock which certainly would not read in an auction bill for an unreserved sale—one, of them said he, was of a large breed, had large bones, and was a rig; another had a complaint which rendered her thin; a third had bowed or bandy legs; a fourth had but one eye; a fifth had two brown trotters, and the others were unshorn. He knew the prisoner and always took him to be an honest comfortable man.

John Creight, a young man from Doneraile, deposed that he saw the prisoner driving these sheep along the road towards Doneraile at half past four o'clock on the morning of the 7th.

Head Constable Cudmore swore that he discovered the sheep on the prisoner's land, and drove them to the pound at Doneraile, where they were given up to the prosecutor's man.

The prisoner was found guilty, and sentenced to three years penal servitude.

Michael Fitzgerald who was arrested by Constable Nash a few days back whilst in the act of selling a watch the property of a Mrs Dore of Newcastle, which she lost in the church yard of Clouncah, was indicted for "stealing from the prisoner," and this being a wrong indictment, the prisoner was acquitted and discharged, and was in George's street on his way home as soon as Mrs Dore and the detecting constable.

The grand jury having concluded their labours at 5 o'clock were discharged by his lordship, who again congratulated them on the peaceable and prosperous state of the county and city.
