THE DERRYKNOCKANE ESTATE.

In connection with the division of Derryknockane estate, a deputation attended the meeting of the Limerick County Council on Saturday, headed by Messrs Clancy, T.D., and McCoy, on behalf of the plotholders, labourers, and uneconomic holders, and represented to the Council that only one labourer out of 50 got any land in the division, and that two employees of a city firm, earning substantial wages, got over 40 acres. The deputation strongly objected to the division as made by the Inspector, and urged the Council to press on the Government the necessity for a re-inspection of those lands with the object of having a more equitable division made.

The Council were in entire agreement with the views of the deputation, if the facts were as stated, and the Secretary was directed to immediately communicate with the Estate Commissioners for a re-inspection.
