

Louis is every where received with enthusiasm: his new Ministry is formed. The say the Bonaparte is still watched at Rochefort; we rather think, that that service is at present, useless; for it is most probable that this lurking Chief is with the army of the Loire, which, so far from having submitted to the new order as we fondly wished, is become an object of suspicion, if not of some share of alarm to Louis. "A corps," says the Paris paper of the 9th "of 50,000 men is to go immediately to the right bank of the Loire, to observe the French army; an English corps will be united to the Prussians. About 150,000 Prussians are encamped on the Place Dauphine; this measure has been occasioned by the provocations of M. Carnot's *Federes*." Such are the words of the Parisian Editor; and yet we find by the same means, that Monsieur CARNOT is with other leaders of his party, at Paris; even it is said that Jerome and Joseph BONAPARTE are there. "in private lodgings" Prince Talleyrand is the countersign to the Royal Ordinances of King Louis. These papers say, that there are constant desertions from BONAPARTE'S army of the Loire; for so, it seems, that army ought to be called. The *Moniteur* of the 10th observes, that—"the worst possible spirit prevails at Orleans, and that there have been bloody scenes acted there, within these few days. The same paper says also—"We are assured, that the chief conspirators, who recalled BONAPARTE from Elba, still hold their secret meetings as they used to do, previous to the 31st of March." Dunkirk, and the departments of Normandy, have hoisted the white flag.

THE ARMY.

With great satisfaction we have heard from good authority that our countryman, Standish O'Grady, Esq. eldest son of the Lord Chief Baron, has been promoted to a troop in the 7th Hussars, in the field, for his gallantry at Waterloo, on the recommendation of his Colonel, the noble the Marquis of Anglesca.

A detachment of the Queen's Bays from York passed through London, on Wednesday last, on their route for embarkation.

The Life Guards, in consequence of their gallant conduct at Waterloo, are to have rank the same as the foot guards.

Friday se'night, the detachments of the 21st, 71st, and 79th regiments embarked at Leith, in high spirits, to join their battalions on the Continent.

The 2d and 6th Dragoon Guards, and the 3d Dragoons, are ordered to Belgium.

The bayonet was never known to have been employed to such an extent and so successfully, as in the late sanguinary contests in Flanders. This weapon was first used by the French in the year 1698, at the battle of Turin.

Wednesday last, the Right Hon. Lord Muskerry arrived in town, and on Thursday, assumed the command of his regiment, the Co. Limerick militia.

Thursday, the City Cork militia were embodied in Cork, and yesterday morning they marched to do duty at Charlesfort, near Kinsale.

On Wednesday last, Major Gen. Lord Blayney, and Gen. Brown, arrived in Dublin, from India.

The head of the late Mr. Whitbread was dissected on Saturday se'night, in the presence of Sir Henry Hallford and other eminent physicians. In examining the brain, water is said to have been found there. The remains were afterwards placed in a leaden coffin, and soldered up. Sunday morning early they were privately conveyed in a hearse to Southill, near Biggleswade, in Bedfordshire, where the family vault is situated.

A meeting took place on Wednesday evening near Tivoli, on the Glanmire Road, near Cork, between Lieut. Colonel Beare and Captain Morgan, both of the City of Cork militia, the latter attended by Captain Jones of the same regi. and the former by James Morgan, Esq. After having exchanged shots, the parties were reconciled, by the interference of their mutual friends.

On Monday se'night at the fair of Kilfacle, a tumultuous mob, of above an hundred men, armed with guns, blunderbusses, swords and pistols, paraded through the fair place for a considerable time, shouting and firing shots, in quest of an opposite faction, who very prudently absented themselves.—We regret to state, that there was neither a magistrate, a soldier, or a policeman, to restrain or subdue, either by their appearance or exertions, so outrageous a violation of the peace.

Last week, the mail coach between Clonmel and Cork commenced running the new line at the Co. of Waterford side of the river, a dead flat to Knocklofty, Kilmainham, and Marlfield, and an unspeakable relief to the cattle and passengers, from the smoothness of the way.
