Lord Palmerston said it was exceedingly painful to him to resist any motion like the present, but he submitted to the House whether it was proper to bring forward subjects of such a general nature. "G. P. R.—The Prince Regent, acting in the name of His Majesty, having taken into consideration the severe distresses and sufferings of the people of several parts of Germany, in consequence of the invasion of that country by the late Emperor of France; recommends to his faithful Commons to give such pecuniary aid as may assist in giving them relief."

A Message on the motion of the Chancellor of the Exchequer, was referred to a Committee of Supply.
