## DEATH OF CHIEF SUPT. McGUIRE.

The death took place in St. Vincent's Hospital, Dublin, on Sunday morning of Mr Francis J. McGuire, Chief Superintendent, Civic Guards, Limerick. The deceased had been ailing since last March, and his death comes as a great shock to his wife and young family. The late Mr McGuire was in his fifty-fifth year, and was a native of Tempo, Co. Fermanagh, and two years ago was transferred from the Depot to Limerick as Chief Superintendent. He was an ex-officer of the Royal Irish Constabulary. Amongst the Garda of Limerick City and County his demise is greatly regretted, and the citizens generally have learned of his death with sorrow. The flag at William-street headquarters station was flown at half-mast.
