**MULGRAVE STREET LORRY ACCIDENT.**

**Fatal Result.**

Catherine Lysaght, aged 22, of Peafield, Ballysimon, who while wheeling a push bicycle in Mulgrave street last Sunday night was knocked down by a motor lorry driven by Patrick Leonard, Knockaney, Hospital, succumbed to her injuries at the County Infirmary on Thursday evening.

An inquest was held yesterday at the Infirmary by Mr Coroner McNeice and a jury.

Mr J S Gaffney, solicitor, appeared for the next-of-kin, and Mr M Tynan, solicitor, for the driver of the car.

Sergeant Swords, C.G, represented the authorities.

John Lysaght identified the body as that of his sister, Catherine Lysaght. She had been working at Messrs Spillane's Tobacco Factory.

Doctor Annie J. Murnane, house surgeon, County Infirmary, stated the deceased was admitted to the institution on the 15th July, at 12 a.m. She found her suffering from fracture of the skull, concussion, and minor injuries to the scalp and knees. Death was due to shock and hæmorrhage from fracture of the skull.

The inquest was adjourned, pending criminal proceedings against Patrick Leonard, who was yesterday remanded on bail to the City District Court, on a charge of manslaughter.

**CO. LIMERICK TRAGEDY.**

Mystery surrounds the death of John Conheady, of Cahirnorry, Co. Limerick, who was discovered shot dead in bed at his residence early on Thursday morning. The police do not entertain the belief that the wounds were self-inflicted, and in support of that conclusion it is learned that no lethal weapon of any kind was found in deceased's house. The back door of the house was on the latch, so that entrance to the premises would be an easy matter. The authorities are still pursuing inquiries into the circumstances of the tragedy. They have scoured the district, and found no firearms missing.
