REPORT upon the PROPOSED MUNICIPAL BOUNDARY of the BOROUGH of YOUGHAL.

THE Borough of Youghal consists of the Town and Liberties.

The ancient Limits of the Town are shown in the Plan as accurately as personal investigation and tradition would admit, and may be said generally to have consisted of the ancient Walls surrounding the Landward part of the Town, and a corresponding Line of Shore. These Limits are no longer recognized for any practical purposes, as the Town has extended much beyond them. The extent of the Lights are used for Local Taxation. ANCIENT LIMITS.

The Liberties extend about four miles in length and three in breadth, and are co-extensive with the Parish of Youghal. The Liberties are only recognized by the Local Authorities for the purposes of local jurisdiction. Liberties.

The Town of Youghal lies on the Shore of the Harbour of the same name. The Main Streets contain several good Dwelling Houses and Shops, and towards the South Houses of a superior description are occupied by persons of independent fortune; and the general appearance of the Town is that of a thriving place. The Harbour at spring tides will admit Vessels of between 400 and 500 Tons, and there is a considerable Trade with England. The Town is lighted with Gas, paved and pitched. DESCRIPTION OF

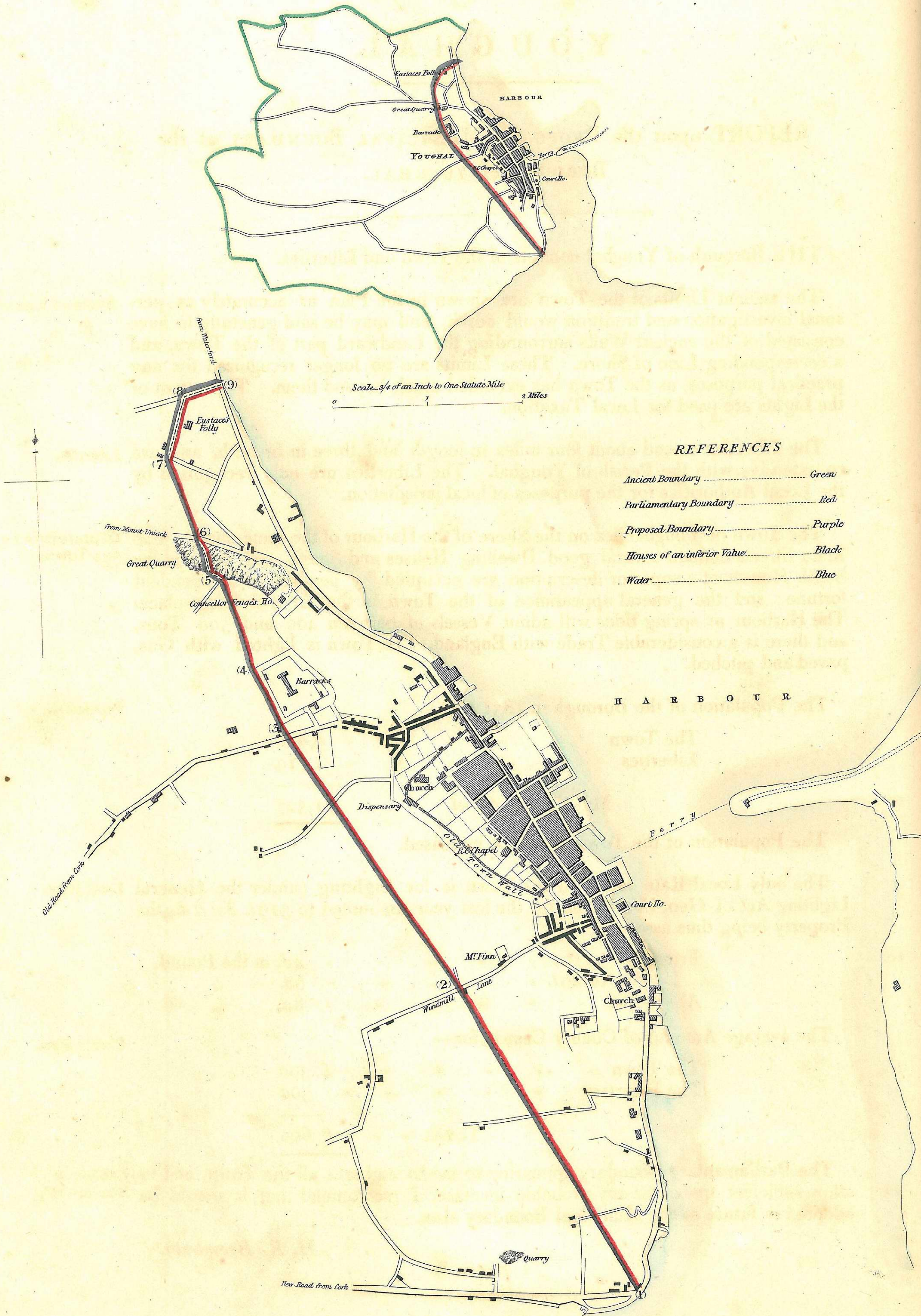
