A vacancy is caused in the representation of Belfast by the death of one of its representatives, Mr. John M'Cance, the radical member for that town, who expired on Monday evening, at Westminster. He fell a victim to the fatigue induced by a close Parliamentary attendance.

The Earl of Clare will arrive at Mount-Shannon on the evening of this day week, the 22d instant, from London, to the great joy of his tenantry, after five years absence in India. The tenants and labourers on his Lordship's property have resolved to welcome their noble benefactor with every demonstration of regard, and for that purpose a numerous but select body will proceed with fancy sashes and cockades to meet his Lordship, and escort him to Mount-Shannon, amidst garlands and laurel wreaths.— Lord Clare is naturally averse to any display of this sort, and so is his representative, Stephen Dickson, Esq. but a grateful tenantry will not be disappointed, and they have prepared every thing at their own expense for this gala.
