Thursday morning the Governor of the county gaol
received from Dublin Castle, an official warrant for the
execution of John Fogarty and Catherine Dillon, on
Saturday next, the 11th inst. The letter, which ac-
panied the order, acknowledged the receipt of
memorials on behalf of each of the unfortunate crimi-
nals, praying a commutation of their sentence, "that
after full inquiry into the circumstances connected
with the perpetration of the foul deed, and conviction
of the prisoners, it was the decision of the Government
that the law should take its course." Fogarty heard
the unwelcome intelligence with composure, and ex-
pressed perfect resignation to meet his fate. Not so
the wretched female, Catherine Dillon, who displayed
total indifference, and said "she never would be
hanged, no matter how they killed her." We regret
to add that the unfortunate woman continues obdu-
rate to all reasoning, and refuses to receive spiritual
admonition from the Roman Catholic clergy, or Sis-
ters of Mercy. Notwithstanding, it is very extraordi-
nary that in a letter to the Castle of Dublin last week,
she admitted her guilt, and prayed for a commutation
of the extreme sentence. No answer has yet been
received from Dublin Castle to a memorial forwarded
on behalf of John Frewen, convicted of the murder
of Peter Nash, at Garden Hill.

An old woman named Eliza Richardson, who lived
on the bounty of humane friends, was found dead in
her room, near Mrs. Villiers Alms-house, on Friday
morning. She was observed entering the apartment
the previous evening.

William Long, a man in the employ of David Ban-
natyne, Esq., whilst hoisting a bag of corn, yesterday,
was struck with the handle of the wrench, inflicting
fracture of thigh and lacerated wound, also laying
bare the femoral artery. He was conveyed to Bar-
rington's Hospital, where he remains in a precarious
state.

On Wednesday, John Cox, Esq., coroner, held an
inquest at Abbeyfeale on the body of a boy named
Duggan, who came by his death in consequence of
injuries from another boy named Hallinan, on the 24th
of last June. There was an examination of the body
by Dr. Ambrose. The jury returned a verdict of
manslaughter against Hallinan, who was arrested to
abide his trial at the next assizes.

On Sunday last, garlic Sunday, there was a patron
at Lahinch, at which great numbers of the country
people attended. In the course of the day there were
evident symptoms of a serious riot, and a faction fight
was anticipated, but the coolness, courage, and good
tact of Constable Robert Constable, and his party of
