MR. TOMMY CAMPION, ASHILL, KILMALLOCK.

The unexpected demise of the late Mr. Tommy Campion, Ashill, Kilmallock, was one of those sad events which aroused the deepest sympathy in the hearts of all who knew him but particularly with those who had intimate association with him and knew to the full his many sterling qualities. He was every inch a man, sympathetic with those in distress and not the least of his good attributes was his charity to those who, he felt, needed a helping hand. He was a son of the late Mr. Thomas Campion, the famous All-Ireland footballer of the late eighties and a member of a family with wide connections throughout the county.

His death took place on the 10th ult., and the remains were conveyed that evening to the Church of SS. Peter and Paul, Kilmallock, when a very large cortege paid a tribute of respect and esteem to the memory of the deceased, as well as sympathy to his sorrowing wife and relatives.
