One cause of this reduction is the issue of fresh provisions every day to our troops serving in the West India and Leeward Islands, which at the time we said must seriously affect the Irish provision contract.

Extract of a letter received at this Office from a correspondent at Naples, dated 31st July:—"The cholera, though a little better, is still raging very badly in Naples; hundreds daily dying of it, many of the Neapolitan nobility; and amongst the English, Mr. Aldridge Busby, Lady Eleonor Butler, sister of the Marquis of Ormonde. Mr. Auldjoe, whose ascent of Mount Vesuvius and also of Mount Blanc, has been published, besides others, have fallen victims. All is consternation and woe here, the Priests carrying about the images of the Saints, and making continual processions in the hope of obtaining relief."

Mary Cooney for the revolting murder of Mrs. Anne Anderson, was executed at Gallows-green, on Monday last, pursuant to sentence. So vast an assemblage of women was never seen collected upon any public occasion in Limerick, and they out-numbered the other sex at least ten to one. The condemned culprit was taken in a covered Cab, to the place of execution, which saved her from the inquisitive stare and distracting comments of vulgar curiosity. Before leaving the City gaol, she freely acknowledged in the presence of the Rev. Mr. Brahan, and the Governor, her guilt, and the justice of her sentence, avowing the most perfect sorrow and penitence. A strong guard of the Queen's Bays, 25th Regt. and City Police formed the escort, and the streets were crowded while the procession passed. The executioner followed in a car, wearing a straw hat and large mask, which effectually concealed his features. So deeply sensible of her crime was the wretched woman, that she kissed the rope which encircled her neck, and humbly implored for mercy. She spoke not a word at the place of execution, and died quietly. The military returned to the prison with the body in a coffin for interment within its walls. This has been the first execution in the City of Limerick, for the last 17 years.
