Yesterday morning a fine two-seater motor car, the property of Mr Paul Bernard, took fire in Henry street, near the corner of Cecil street. The tank was being replenished when the accident occurred, and it is believed to have been due to leakage therefrom. The flames rapidly spread to the body of the vehicle. The Corporation Fire Brigade arrived speedily, and had the fire soon got under, but not before the car was gutted and otherwise seriously damaged.

ENGLISH RAILWAY WAGES.

Yesterday the English railway shopmen accepted the wage settlement terms agreed on between the company directors and the heads of the unions. The new scale will come into force on Monday next.

ANTI-WAR PACT.

The Kellogg Pact to renounce war will, it is stated, be signed by Dr. Stresemann on behalf of Germany. Britain's reservations to the pact have evoked no surprise in Washington.
