CITY ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

A conference representative of the Harbour Board and the Corporation was held at the Harbour Offices last evening for the purpose of discussing a proposal by the Corporation to erect steel standards to carry electric current on overhead wires from Messrs. Siemens-Schuckert's works to the Power Station, O'Curry-street. It is the intention of the Corporation to supplement by this arrangement the city's electricity supply, but the Harbour Board was anxious that the arrangement would not interfere with shipping, as the supply would be carried across the Sarsfield Bridge and along the line of quays.

After a conversation, the conference arrived at a satisfactory decision, except on one point—namely, that the height of the standards at the lie-bye, where vessels pass through to Arthur's Quay, should be not less than a hundred feet.

DEATH OF MR. JAMES HARTY.

An old and respected citizen, in the person of Mr James Harty, passed away last night at his residence, William-street, at the advanced age of 85 years. The deceased was one of the best-known members of the Limerick Pigbuyers' Association, and all his dealings were characterised by uprightness and straightforwardness. He was connected with the trade all his life, and was known throughout the south, west, and midlands. He was father of Mr C. Harty, ex-President Athlunkard Boat Club and Garryown Football Club.
