 Hill, now Marquis of Downshire, born 8th
 October, 1788—two other sons and two

 mach. His Lordship had a slight fit in his hands
 feet, and seemed to be recovering, when one
 unexpected changes of that uncertain dis-
 directed its violence towards the stomach,
 produced almost instant death.—It is menti-
 that so well aware was the late Marquis
 approaching dissolution, we suppose from

his Majesty, in order to mark in the strongest
 manner, the faith &c. he has derived from the
 zeal and loyalty of the Corps, has directed, that
