Stephen Cahill, to be burned in the hand, imprisoned for three month, and to give security to keep the peace for two years.

Richard Butler, to be publickly whipped through the town of Lifmore on Saturday the 30th of September, and Saturday the 7th of October next, to stand in the pillory for one hour on each of faid days immediately after being whipped, and to give fecurity to keep the peace for two years.

Early last Saturday morning, William Connor was efcorted by a party of the army from our county gaol, to Carrick-beg, where he was publickly whipped, purfuant to his fentence at the last affizes, for affociating with those deluded people called Right Boys.

Same night he was brought back and lodged in gaol.

TRALEE, September 18. On their way Mr. Herbert received information, that some principals of those misguided people were then at the chapel of Fieries, a finall dillance off the road, and having furrounded it, be took Peter Daly, James Savage, and Timothy Cafey, against whom, we hear positive informations are given .-- On fearching Daly, a fword was found concealed Square, the lady of Stephen Rice, jun.
