day, the Right Worshipful Robert Briscoe, Esq;  
Coroner, held an Inquest on the body of Patrick

the Jury returned a Verdict, "That he was of In-  
ane mind, and that whether drowned by accident or his  
rown wilful act, could not be ascertained."

Yesterday, his Worship held an Inquest on the Body of

brought in a Verdict, "That he was drowned in the River  
Shannon on the 29th August last, by having accidentally  
fallen off one of the Quays of this City."—This young
