Prices as compared with last year showed a drop of from £1 15s. per head according to the grades; this drop in values seems to be general throughout the country. Lambs in strong supply, forward lots selling very well compared to take ruling prices. A clear market in this department was not effected, but a considerable number were sold. Breeding ewes in good supply, and in this department the market was active and firm; nearly all lots were sold. Fat and store sheep were in good demand; more could have been sold. Lambs were in plentiful supply, but the pure-bred Suffolks were passed out at 8 and 9 guineas.
