DEATH OF MR. GEO. O'CALLAGHAN, CO.C.

The death occurred at Castlemahon, Newcastle West, yesterday, of Mr George O'Callaghan, after a few months' illness, in his fifty-fifth year. Mr O'Callaghan was National teacher of Castlemahon Schools, and an ex-President of the Irish National Teachers' Organization, and of the Central Executive Committee of that body. He was in June of last year elected a member of the Limerick County Council, and was an active and intelligent public representative. He was one of the candidates selected on the Labour Panel to contest Limerick at the next Dail elections.

At a meeting of the Limerick County Board of Health, Mr M. Quinlan, Co.C., presiding, on the motion of Mr E. L. Lloyd, Co.C., seconded unanimously, the following vote of sympathy was passed :—"That we, the members of the Limerick County Board of Health, have heard of the premature demise of Mr George O'Callaghan, a popular and zealous member of the County Council. We tender to his sorrowing family and wide circle of relatives and friends expressions of our profound regret and sympathy in their sad bereavement ; and as a mark of respect to the memory of deceased we adjourn this meeting."

The Chairman said the late Mr O'Callaghan was a worthy and intelligent member of the County Council and the Board, and he (the Chairman) felt his loss, as he had been a personal friend. Mr O'Callaghan was an honest and useful member of the Council, and he (Chairman) had come into contact with relatives of the deceased, and found them to be very intelligent and well educated. The late Mr O'Callaghan would be a great loss to the Labour Organisation whom he represented.

The meeting then adjourned without transacting any business.

WOMAN'S DEATH FROM BURNS.
