Trade was somewhat except for choice dairy cows, which were sold, and more could have been sold. Top price of the market was offered by Mr. Patrick Kennedy, Kilderry, for a calved dairy cow at £41. 10s., best, £34 to £41; promising, £28 to £30 10s.; ordinary, £18 to £25; in-calf dairy heifers, promising, £29 to £31; ordinary, £22 to £27 10s.; small, £18 to £21.
